LOWER ALLEN TOWNSHIP

Department of Public Safety

During the month of October, the COVID-19 pandemic continued to be an integral part of Department of Public Safety operations. I followed the statewide statistics on the Department of Health dashboard, which was sent daily by PA Chiefs email. Although the numbers of positive cases continued, the seriousness of the virus in terms of hospitalizations and deaths continued to decline. By the end of the month infection rates began to escalate again. We maintained the highest levels of universal precautions to safeguard public safety personnel who may be exposed to citizens infected with the virus.

Much of my time, as Director and Emergency Management Coordinator, I continued to focus on monitoring the public safety preparedness and response to the potential virus impact to the employees and the Lower Allen Community. I also monitored the PEMA, FEMA, county EMA releases daily, and attended the Wednesday National COVID-19 White House Briefings offered virtually. We continued to plan for the potential of a fall surge in cases. Surveillance and contact with our retirement facilities continued, at times daily to monitor their infection situations.

We also continued creation of a stockpile of sanitation products, i.e., masks, gloves, gowns, and other protective items to safeguard responders. With the unknown in terms of a resurgence of the virus, as well as a history of logistics supply failures. We continue to see a need to have an inventory to prepare for the worst if a spike occurs in the fall or over the winter. EMS was tasked with taking the lead on this and continued to assist with the procurement of N-95, surgical masks, sanitation supplies and hand sanitizers to coordinate all supplies for public safety.

Overall call volume continued to increase throughout the month and return to pre-COVID levels. Many of the meetings scheduled for public safety continued to be online through Zoom or Web-ex, although we did resume some face-to-face meetings both within the department and externally. The exception has been the Cumberland County Chief of Police meetings which returned to being in-person with social distancing.

A great deal of time this month was also focused on working with staff and finance preparing the 2021 budget documents.

The highlights of October included:

October 2nd – Civil Service Commission meeting to approve hiring list for police officer. October 21-23rd – Attended virtual sessions of the International Association of Chiefs of Police offered at no cost to members.

Attended numerous staff meetings and the public safety coordination meeting.

DEPARTMENT HEAD:

Aside from cancellation of Halloween activities, October saw police department activities and working conditions about as close to normal as they had been since the start of this pandemic. As next month's report will show (and as of this writing), that respite will be short-lived. We continue to adapt to everchanging conditions, guidance and recommendations as we brace for what is reported to be the next surge of the virus.

The department welcomed Officer Chimel-Freeburn and Officer Fitzkee this month. They will begin field training in November.

Throughout the month, Captain Crone attended Board of Commissioners Meetings, Department Head Meetings, Police Command Staff meetings, a Public Safety Coordination meeting, budget preparation meetings, a Civil Service Commission meeting, a CODY NIBRS webinar, and a Field Training Officer meeting/training session.

Captain Crone continues to work with Dianna Knisley to fulfill agency obligations regarding preparation to receive the Body-Worn Camera grant. This project is expected to be implemented in early 2021.

The patrol officer of the month Officer Alex Milletics. Officer Milletics handled the highest number of UCR investigations out of the entire department (12) during the month of October. He also handled 52 calls as primary officer and initiated 19 traffic stops, the most on his squad. One of his traffic stops resulted in a seizure of drugs. Also, on 10/10/20, Ofc Milletics responded to a call at the Capital City Mall regarding an individual trying to sell unlocked phones. Ofc Milletics was able to locate and detain two suspects who both physically resisted prior to backup arriving. With assistance from mall security, both were taken into custody without issue.

Congratulations to Officer Milletics for his continued hard work!

NALOXONE

There were no Naloxone administrations by police personnel in Lower Allen Township this month.



MONTHLY TOP 40 INCIDENT COUNT BY TYPE and SELECTED OFFICER LOG FIGURES



During the month of October 2020, LATPD made arrests or filed criminal charges on 29 individuals, issued 23 non-traffic citations, 60 traffic citations, 60 warnings, and 18 parking tickets.

LOWER ALLEN TOWNSHIP

Department of Public Safety

In October, we began experiencing a steady uptick in the number of COVID-19 patients being treated and transport by Lower Allen Township EMS. The increase in numbers experienced by EMS corresponded with the increasing numbers in Cumberland County and across the Commonwealth. The second wave COVID-19 appears to have arrived.

The silver lining is we are far better prepared and can be proactive in our response to the second wave. We have started the second wave with all the PPE on hand and able to meet all the CDC and DOH guidance to ensure the safety of personnel and the residents of Lower Allen Township.

We still have limitations, but those limitations are across the board for all organizations and we are far ahead in those areas compared to the start of the pandemic in March.

We have reached out to key partners at Bethany Village, The Woods and SCIC to determine if they have any unmet needs we can assist with as well as their status with COVID-19 patients. These relationships were key in limiting the impact of the first wave. The second wave will have a far greater impact due to being community wide and not isolated in pockets.

A major improvement is our overall knowledge of the virus and access to the necessary information required to make major decisions to ensure the health and well-being of all staff and the residents of Lower Allen Township

In addition to the second wave of COVID-19, the 2020-2021 flu season has started, and the predictions are very uncertain regarding the impact of the flu in conjunction with COVID-19. Flu vaccinations for township staff were offered by Human Resources and are available and being provided by EMS.

October continued to be busy month with the budget process and EMS worked hard to ensure a fiscally responsible budget was submitted. The support and enthusiasm for EMS from the Board of Commissioners is greatly appreciated.

In October, EMS continued to struggle with staffing issues. Solutions have been developed and are actively being implemented to ensure the highest quality of service to the residents of Lower Allen Township. COVID-19 has affected EMS staffing across the commonwealth due to people leaving EMS as a result of the pandemic and the number of educational opportunities available to become an EMT, Advanced EMT and Paramedic greatly declined in 2020. A key in reducing the impact for Lower Allen Township EMS is to ensure all positions are filled and continually be recruiting part-time personnel. The availability of part-time personnel has decreased due to employers prohibiting outside employment and individuals who do not want to take the extra risk an exposure at a part-time employer.

The Community paramedicine partnership with UPMC continues to be active and moving in a very positive direction.

Captain Deaven continues to actively participate in EHSF, PA Bureau of EMS, Pennsylvania Emergency Health Services Council, Ambulance Association of Pennsylvania and Pennsylvania Fire and Emergency Services Institute.

EMS is continuing to treat sicker patients because of delaying health care during the first wave of the pandemic. Additionally, due to the increase of COVID-19 EMS is treating COVID-19 requiring critical support as a result of the virus.






