2020 YEAR END REPORT PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

The Public Works Department has come full circle, completing another year of service to the Lower Allen Township residents. We pride ourselves in the work we do and strive to serve the Township residents in the most cost efficient and convenient ways possible under all circumstances. We wish everyone a very happy, healthy and prosperous New Year!

Crews wrapped up leaf collection, on the 11th of the month. The street sweeper didn't make it through the Township; due to the first snow fall coming into the region, on the afternoon of the 16th. Crews worked around the clock keeping Township roadways as clear as possible. Most of our current crew, are new to the job, and still learning the ins and outs of plowing, in the Township. Resident complaint calls were at a minimum, for the size of the storm and the large snow amounts; that came down quickly, overnight on the 16th. I'd like to thank our Crew for their hard work, before, during and after the storm, and for their dedication to the Township.

Contractor, brush permits are suspended for 2021. The County machine charge, for using the horizontal grinder, continues to rise each year. By limiting the amount of brush we accept, rising costs will be kept within budget. Leaf compost will not be available to residents, due to using the product to bring Lower Allen's drain basins up to State regulations. Wood chips will still be available for pick up, and deliveries will start Thursday and Friday mornings, in April, 2021.

Christmas tree pickup is scheduled for January 4th – January 15th, 2021. Residents are welcome to drop off their brush or any Christmas trees, at Public Works, Monday through Friday between the hours of 7:00am – 3:00pm. The curbside brush pickup, by Penn Waste Services, will resume, with the first trash pickup date, in April 2021.
