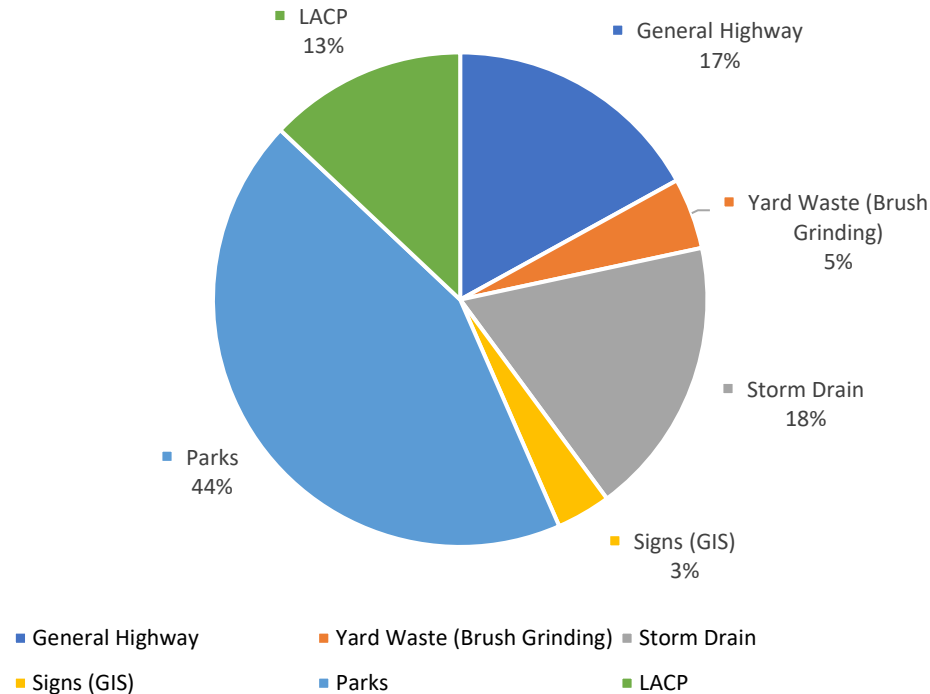


Public Works Operations Report: September 2022

The following chart displays areas of focus and percentages for all work performed during the month:



The following list provides items of mention for the month including tasks completed and underway:

- Allendale Way work completed including blacktopping around manholes, installation of a new manhole covers, and the replacement of a drain box.
- Beaver Road work completed including blacktopping around and replacement of manholes.
- Ben Peters participated in road evaluations of Allendale, Beaver, Highland, and Sheepford.
- Rich Dillon and Rusty Olson completed the County's recycling program training.
- Staff participated in the Hampden Township Symposium where Andy Fullerton and Greg Obin received traffic control certifications and Ben Peters was certified in roadway spraying.
- Leaf piles turned, screened, and hauled to rear pad at Public Works Building.
- Removed fallen trees and debris from storms throughout the Township.
- Removed concrete pad originally used for shuffleboard at Highland Park and reseeded.
- Continued roadway mowing, and street sweeping in concentrated areas.
- Brush grinding resumed with multiple breakdowns from metal in yard waste bins and brush piles passing through the machine; Penn Waste and Graybill were contacted to remedy this.
- Cedar Springs Run Park maintenance included power washing of bridge and walkway, clearing banks of weeds, edging, replacement of wood carpet, and other general maintenance tasks.
- LACP maintenance included power washing Keystone Pavilion, park sign inventory and replacement, mowing, ballfield maintenance and other general maintenance tasks.
