Department of Public Safety



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During February, the COVID-19 pandemic continued to be an integral part of the Department of Public Safety operations as planning continued for 1-A vaccinations. A Google docs spreadsheet was created, and public safety staff was polled to obtain interest in receiving the vaccine. The Captains kept in contact with staff and as information became available on vaccines and sites, coordination with staff was conducted.

I also continued to follow the statewide statistics on the Department of Health dashboard. During the month, infection rates began to fluctuate with a downward trend. Public safety personnel continued the strict universal precautions protocols we initiated in the early months of 2020. Work from home policies were liberally permitted for staff whose job responsibilities, and technology would allow that practice. As continued practice from 2020, we maintained the highest levels of safeguard to the public and our public safety personnel who may be exposed to citizens infected with the virus.

Much of my time, as Director and Emergency Management Coordinator, continued to focus on monitoring the public safety preparedness and response to the potential virus impact to the employees and the Lower Allen Community. I also monitored the PEMA, FEMA, county EMA releases daily, and attended the Wednesday National COVID-19 White House Briefings offered virtually.

February 16th – Attended a virtual training webinar on Crimewatch software program.

February 26th – Attended the Director's meeting to discuss evaluation system improvements

Attended numerous staff meetings and the public safety coordination meeting.

We still have one officer on light-duty.


The Patrol Officer of the Month is Kevin Cramer. During the month of February, Ofc Cramer responded to the most incidents and was the primary officer on the most incidents for his squad. The most significant incident Ofc. Cramer was involved in was the apprehension of two fraud suspects from Bonefish Grill. The first suspect was apprehended by Ofc. Cramer after a foot pursuit and attempted Taser-ing. Ofc. Cramer used an armbar takedown on the suspect and secured him in handcuffs, after the suspect ran back inside the restaurant. Ofc. Cramer then assisted in locating the second suspect who had fled the scene as well. When officers located the second suspect, Ofc. Cramer recognized a green credit card that the suspect pulled out of his pocket as the same card used at Bonefish. This suspect was detained and then placed under arrest. 


MONTHLY TOP 40 INCIDENT COUNT BY TYPE and SELECTED OFFICER LOG FIGURES

The start of 2021 was very challenging because of the COVID-19 pandemic. February saw a continued decrease in the frequency of suspected COVID-19 patients and confirmed COVID-19 patients. Bethany Village, The Woods and Encompass all started to decrease their number of COVID-19 patients. SCIC tested all inmates resulting in increase in cases within the county.

EMS is continuing to frequently treat, and transport suspected and confirmed COVID-19 patients, but the situation is improving. The effects of the COVID-19 pandemic go well beyond the disease. EMS is seeing an increase in mental health patients, overdoses and a continued increase in cardiac arrest patients.

Data for 2020 demonstrates the secondary effects of the COVID-19 pandemic in Lower Allen Township. 2020 data compared to 2019 data shows citizens requesting 911 for cardiac related emergencies, decreased by 42% while strokes increased by 21% and cardiac arrest increased by 77%. EMS is taking steps to educate the public and increase awareness thorough Social Media and an article in the spring newsletter.

All COVID-19 safety practices were reviewed to ensure effectiveness. Staff suggestions and recommendations were solicited using an anonymous survey in PowerDMS. The feedback from staff was very positive. Staff has a solid understanding of all policies and procedures and using them properly and effectively.

EMS began the process of implementing the Cumberland County Hexagon mobile responder feature by researching hardware and software requirements. The mobile responder feature streamlines communications between county and our units as well as providing an integrated routing feature using automated vehicle locators (AVL).

In mid-December UPMC suspended in person community paramedicine visits. The suspension was lifted at the beginning of February. Patient referrals began immediately, and community paramedicine visits resumed.

A second community paramedicine program was started in February, by Lower Allen EMS, specifically targeting residents who requested EMS but did not agree to be transported to a hospital. Residents in the township receive a follow-up phone call and if necessary, a visit to ensure they are healthy and are satisfied with the service they received. This process ensures the residents safety and reduces the risk for the Township.


In February three courses (Blended/on-line) were developed for March in the areas of documentation, vehicle operations and safe lifting and moving. These courses provide continuing education for staff certifications and refresh knowledge to ensure safety and compliance.

Captain Deaven continues to actively participate in the Cumberland County EMS council, Emergency Health Services Federation (EHSF), PA Bureau of EMS, Pennsylvania Emergency Health Services Council,

Ambulance Association of Pennsylvania and Pennsylvania Fire and Emergency Services Institute. Captain Deaven was appointed to the state 911 advisory board for EMS.


LATEMS has continued to deliver high quality, effective, efficient, and safe patient care directly to their side in every location. In February LATEMS touched the lives of **232** people.

Request for Service 2015 to 2021




