

SEPTEMBER 2021 MONTHLY REPORT

Department of Public Safety



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During September, the COVID-19 pandemic practices placed in effect through the Public Safety Administrative Order 2021-01 at the end of May continued in effect. All staff were kept up to date with statistics of infection rates and hospitalizations. The Emergency Health Services Council continued with their weekly Wednesday morning COVID briefing via an online presentation. As I continued to monitor the PEMA, FEMA, and county EMA releases daily, it was evident that case rates and hospitalizations continued to increase in Cumberland County and surrounding counties. Staff was advised to continue strict protocols with personal protective equipment and sanitation. To date, public safety has had no work-related COVID infections of staff.

The highlights of September included:

September 1st - Attended the South-Central Task Force Criminal Justice Subcommittee virtually via Zoom. We continue the task force meeting virtually due to COVID infection rates. I chair that subcommittee. Detailed most of the day and evening monitoring Ida rainfall and issues that affected the Township.

September 2nd – Attended a Lexipol Connect training presentation online with Capts Wirth and Deaven, Lexipol provides certified training for fire and EMS providers. We evaluated the product to determine if it would be a cost-benefit to our staff.

September 8th - Captain Wirth and I met with Jeff Glass from United Methodist Home for Children. UMHC is reviewing their site emergency plan and requested assistance with that review and any recommendations for updates.

September 14th – Participated in the “All-Hands” PSO meeting hosted by Captain Wirth.

September 15th – Submitted final budget to finance for all public safety disciplines. Successfully gained the percentage caps as directed by the Board for the 2022 budget.

September 21st – Participated in a Crimewatch meeting with Lt Foltz to discuss utilization of the software and our activity as a department. We also discussed possible improvements the vendor could make to the product. Crimewatch continues to be an outstanding value add to our community outreach and crime solving capabilities.

Attended numerous meetings throughout the month including Board of Commissioners, department head, Chiefs of Police, EMS Council, staff meetings, EOC meetings with Planner Strawser, and alarm standards meetings for the AVS-01 TMA ANSI standard development.

Commissioners Meetings, Department Head Meetings, a County Chiefs' meeting, a Public Safety Captains' meeting, various budget-related meetings, pipeline emergency training, preparatory meetings for school bus/teen driver safety week, various radio replacement meetings and various personnel-related meetings.

Officers Hughes and Lewis are underway in the academy. Both have had leadership opportunities already and have been doing well. Officer Kell continues field training and is also doing well.

Preparation for the 4th annual CALEA compliance check is well underway. This will occur in early October. The final assessment for this cycle will occur 11/28-12/1. The assessment will be remote this time. Captain Crone and Compliance Specialist Echterling are working to find out exactly how the mechanics of this process will work and will be preparing for same.

Officer of the month for August is Ofc Torrie Shiley. He had several outstanding incidents this month, including:

- On September 14, 2021, Ofc Shiley along with Ofc Boldosser assisted New Cumberland PD for suspicious activity calls. Ofc Shiley encountered a female displaying a gun and was able to get her to place the weapon down without a use of force.
- On September 23, 2021, Ofc Shiley dealt with a suspicious person in the Sheetz parking lot. He was able to get consent to search the vehicle.
- On September 23, 2021, Ofc Shiley made an arrest for simple assault at the United Methodist Home. He was able to communicate with all the parties and calm a very tense situation that we encountered on arrival.
- On September 28, 2021, Ofc Shiley was called about a pedestrian on Rt 15. Another department dealt with the subject earlier in the night and described the subject as very uncooperative. Ofc Shiley was able to communicate effectively with the subject and have him transported to Harrisburg, so he was off the highway.
- On September 28, 2021, Ofc Shiley encountered a suspicious vehicle which resulted in the arrest of a female on a bench warrant out of Dauphin County.

Ofc Shiley's calm and confident demeanor when encountering citizens continues to be a productive way of relating to them. These are just a few of the stand-out examples of his day-to-day communication style. This goes far in gaining cooperation and compliance without having to impose his will.

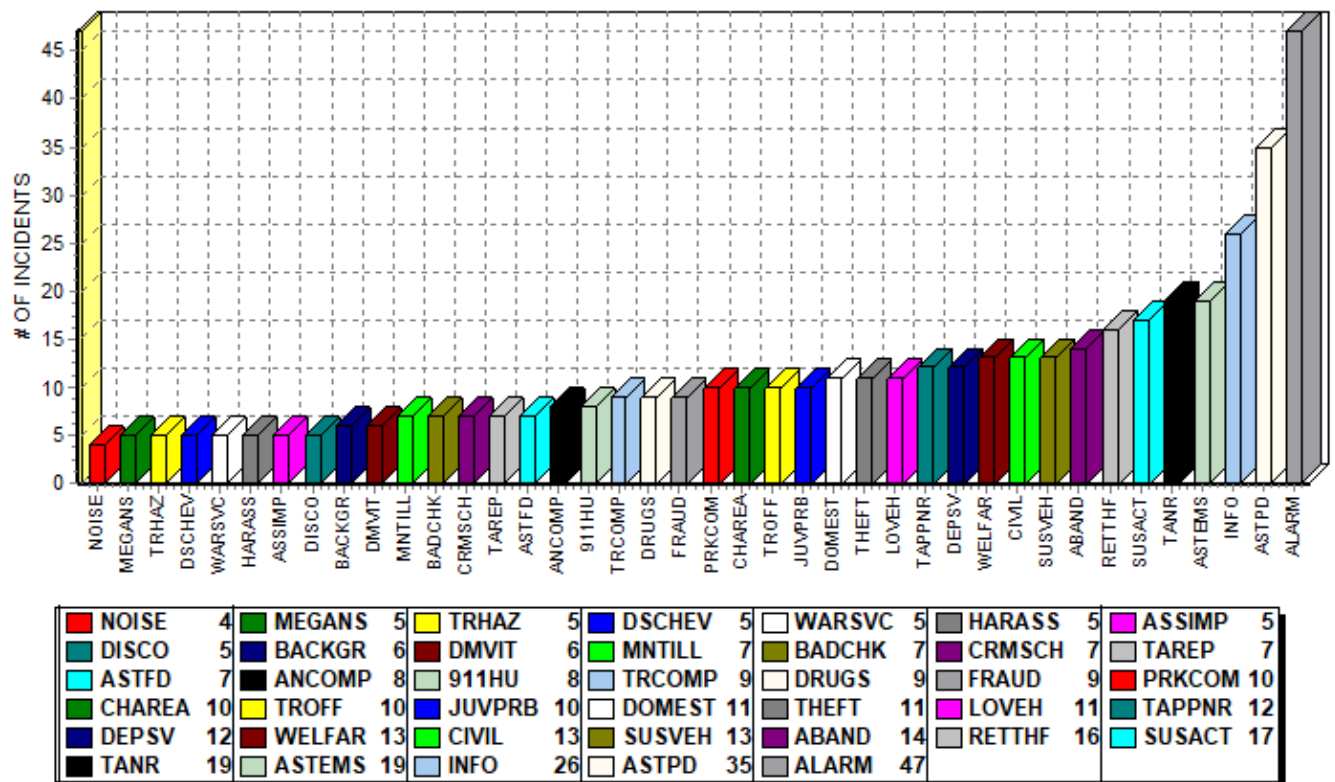

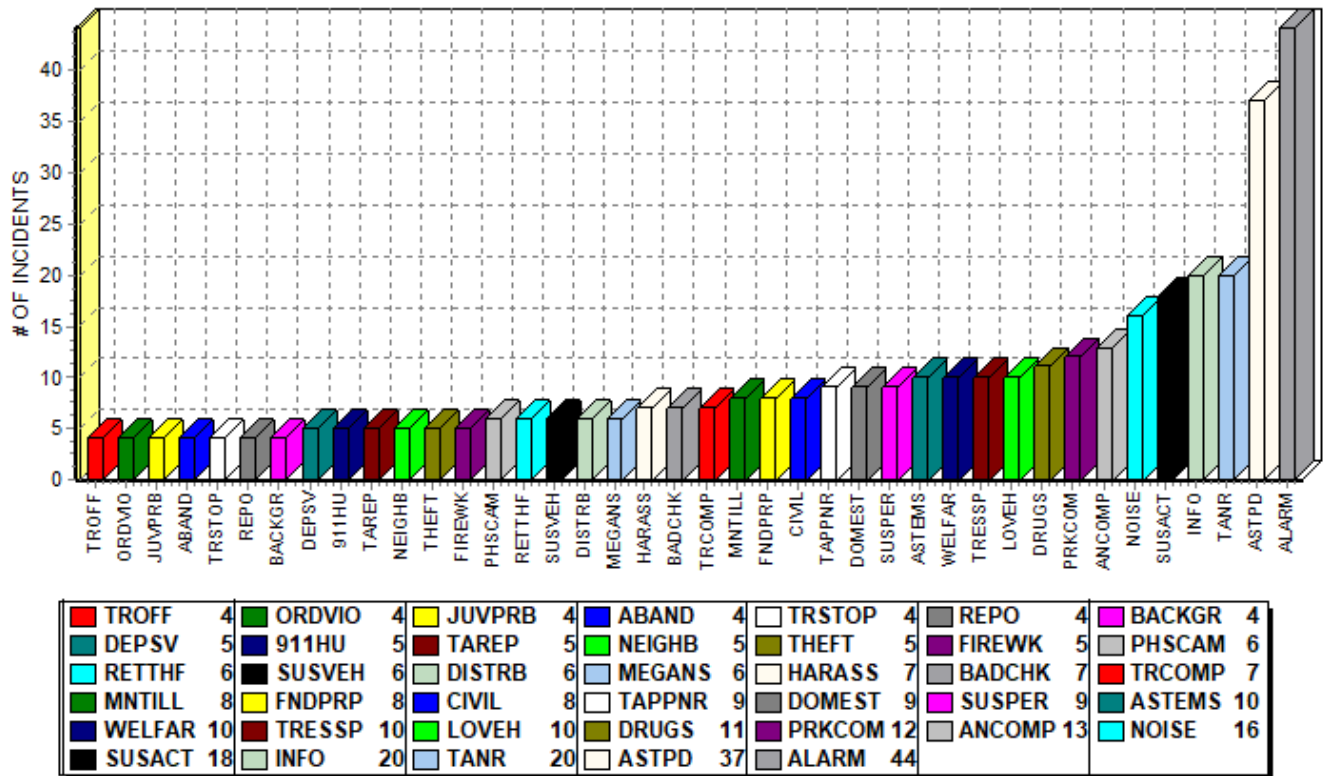
MONTHLY TOP 40 INCIDENT COUNT BY TYPE and SELECTED OFFICER LOG FIGURES

In September, the Lower Allen Twp. Police Dept. (LATPD) had 1,075 dispatched calls for service from Cumberland County Communications resulting in 573 reports. Of those reports, 113 were UCR related.

During the month of September, LATPD made arrests or filed criminal charges on 45 individuals, issued 15 non-traffic citations, 31 traffic citations, 74 warnings, and 28 parking tickets.

There were 41 crashes reported to LATPD in September. Of those 41 crashes, 8 were reportable crashes and 33 were non-reportable crashes.

September provided a variety of opportunities for EMS to serve the citizens of Lower Allen Township and demonstrate the value EMS provides to the residents of Lower Allen Township. The mission of Lower Allen Township EMS is to provide the citizens and visitors of Lower Allen Township with the full spectrum of Pre-hospital care, executing the mission with compassion and competence, as a fully integrated public safety model. EMS strives to meet the mission and exceed the expectations of the citizens of Lower Allen Township.

The 2022 budget was developed and submitted in September. Suggestions and recommendation on how to improve EMS services for the residents of Lower Allen Township were requested and received from the staff. The entire EMS team is focused on ensuring excellent patient care is provided to the residents of Lower Allen Township while maintaining fiscal responsibility. The 2022 EMS budget submitted for approval is well under the department fiscal requirements set by the Board of Commissioners. The 2022 budget meets the EMS needs for residents of Lower Allen Township EMS in 2022. The 2022 budget ensures the highest quality of patient care possible while maintaining fiscal responsibility for the residents of Lower Allen Township.

The Pennsylvania Department of Health Bureau of Emergency Medical Services released updated EMS protocols for Basic Life Support and Advanced Life Support. These protocols are research based and provide the minimum standards of care expected for the treatment of Basic and Advanced Life Support patients. LATEMS staff began the educational process and will complete the required education and training by October 31, 2021.

LATEMS personnel have been participating in a statewide antibiotic pilot program. This pilot program allows paramedics to administer an antibiotic (Cefalozin) in the field. The administration of antibiotic in the field for patients suffering from open traumatic injuries reduces morbidity and mortality. In September LATEMS personnel again administered Cefalozin to a patient with no complications.

Lower Allen Township EMS was invited to participate by the Emergency Health Services Federation (EHSF) in a regional **AVIVE** AED pilot program focusing on eastern Cumberland County. This project has the potential to be a watershed moment in improving the outcomes of patients suffering Out of Hospital Cardiac Arrest. This project will begin in October. 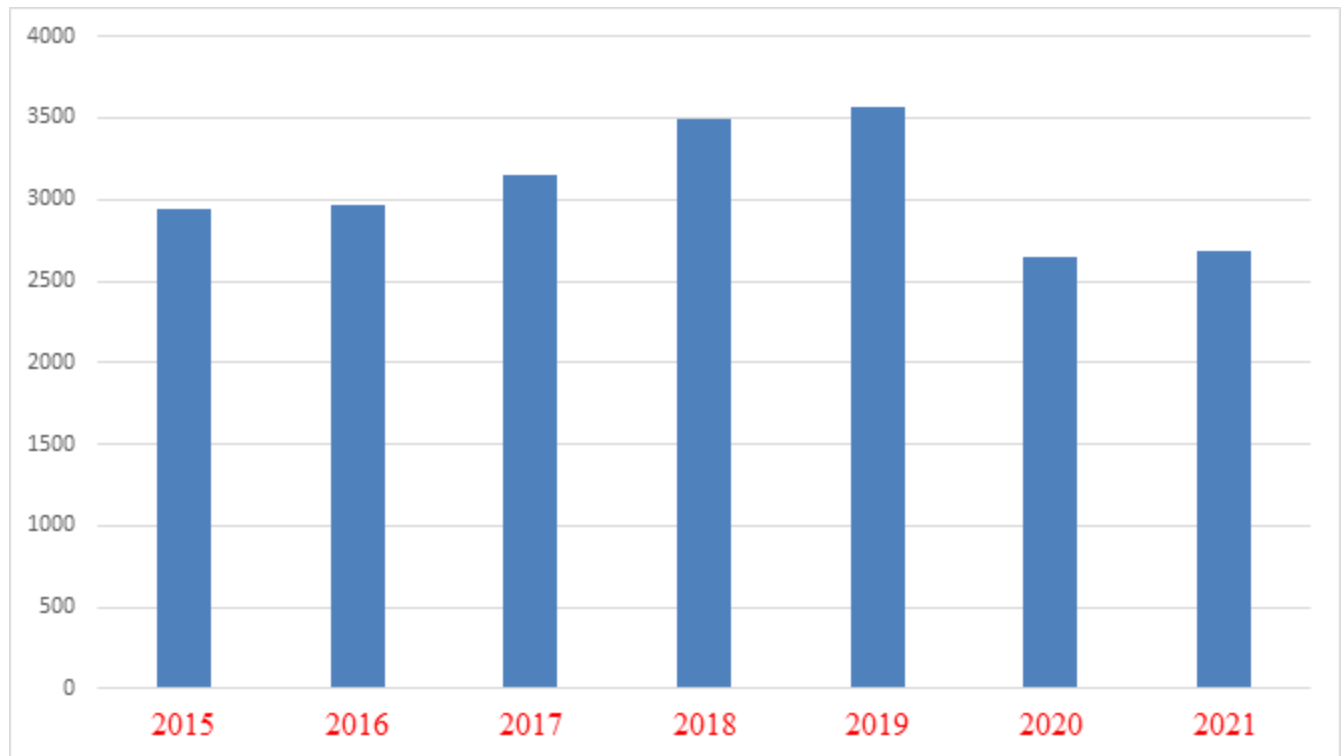

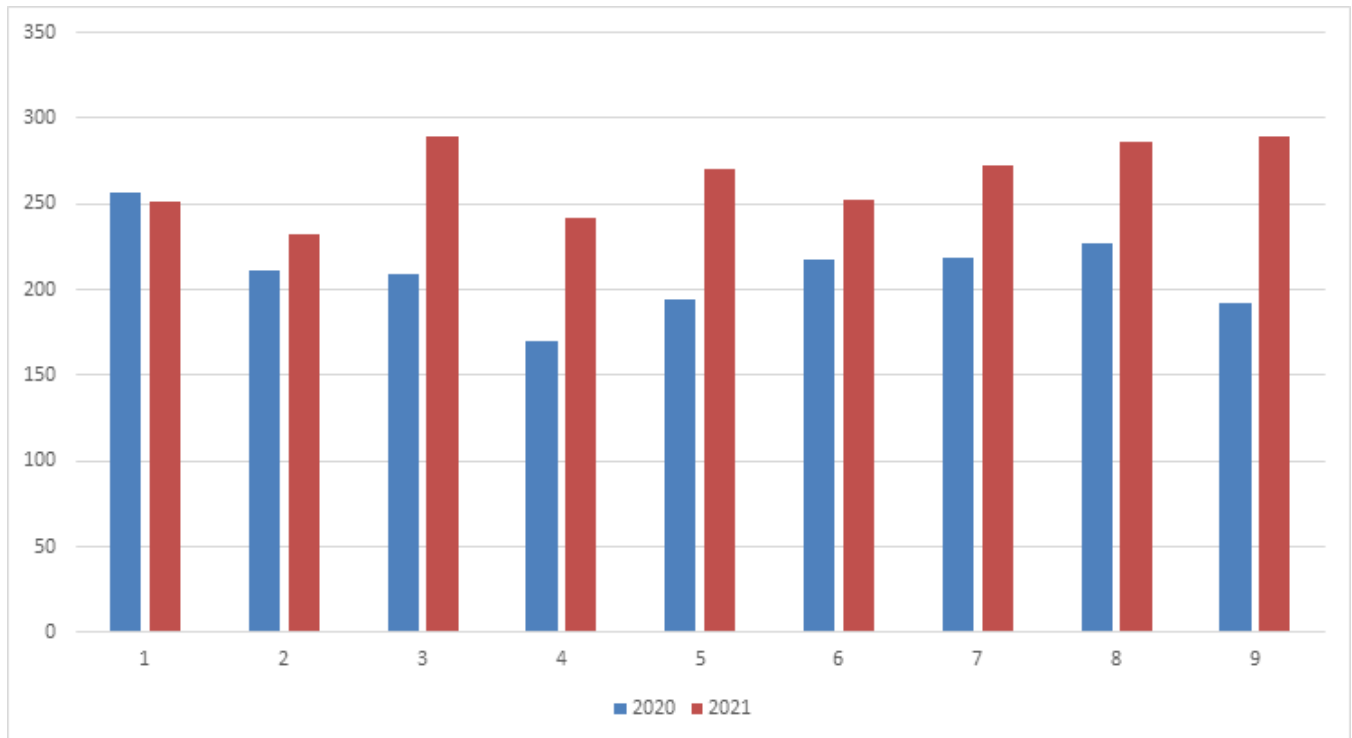

Request for Service 2015 to 2021

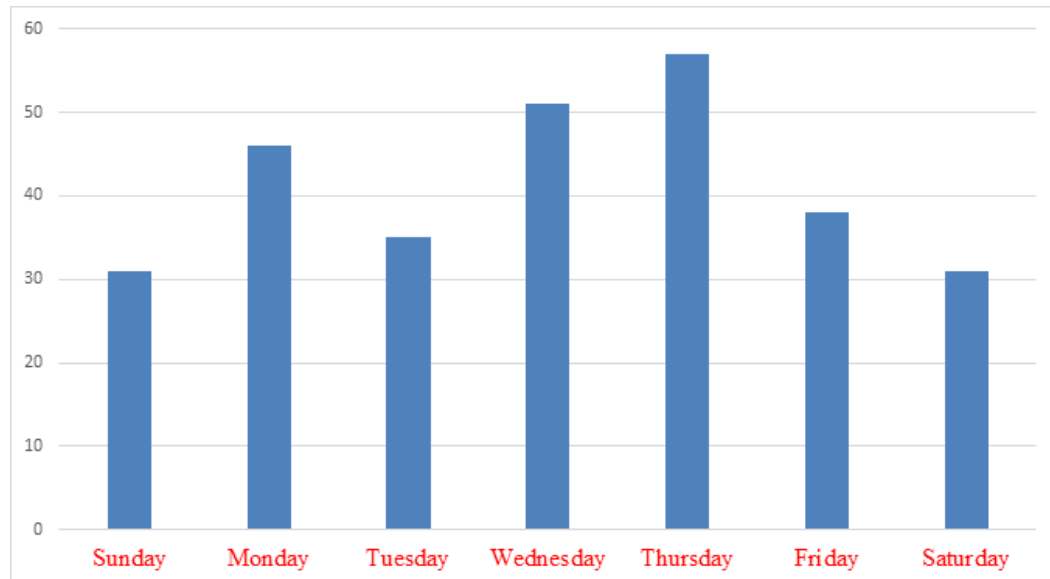

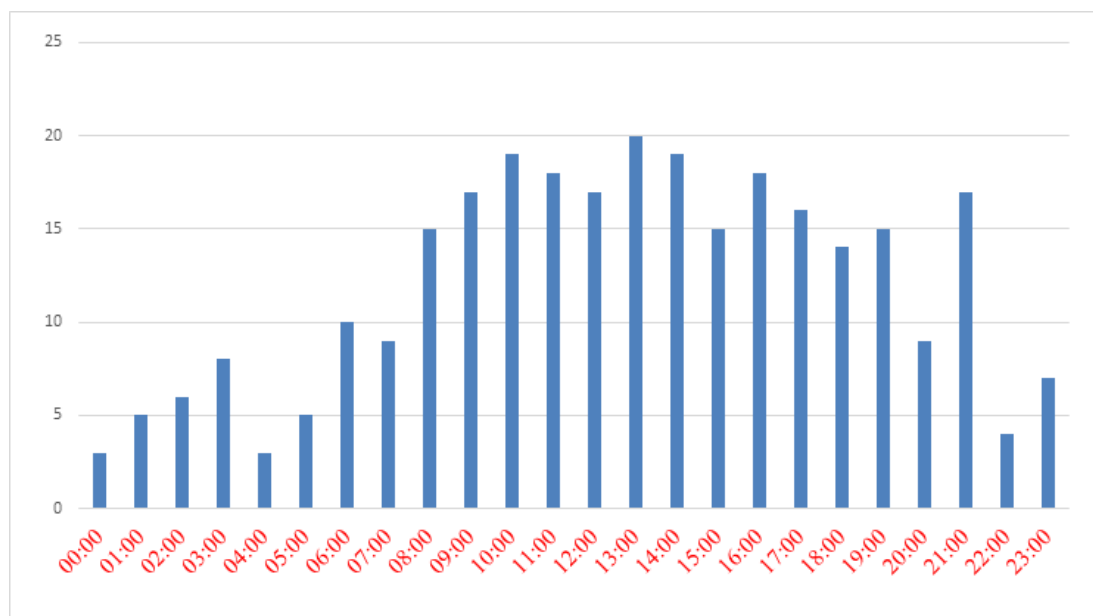
Monthly Request for Service 2020 and 2021



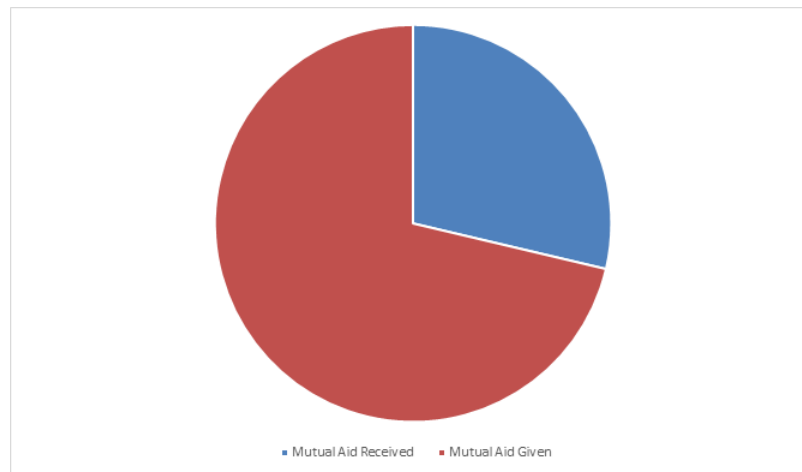
September-Request for Service by Day of the Week
