

Serving Youth Baseball



Bob Yetter was appointed Solicitor to the Lower Allen Township Board of Commissioners and the Lower Allen Township Authority in the fall of 1967, and served continuously until his death on January 7, 2000 following an

automobile accident. Attorney Yetter had few equals in the practice of municipal law. As part of his service to Lower Allen Township, he prepared numerous innovative ordinances for Lower Allen Township, many of which are used as model ordinances by other municipalities throughout Pennsylvania.

Bob valued spending time with his wife, visiting his three grown children, and babysitting his grandchildren. He loved to share his passion for sports, movies, dining out and military history with his family and friends. Bob began coaching softball when his daughter became involved and from there went on to coach baseball when his son played. Overall he spent 13-15 years coaching both softball then baseball. It was always important to Bob that every boy or girl got a chance to play. He had a knack for making every player feel

important. The kids enthusiastically came out for practices.

Those who only dealt with Mr. Yetter during his tenacious case preparation or from the opposite side of a legal argument lost out on



seeing the side of Bob that we are honoring with this field. Robert E. Yetter was an extremely kind and generous man and he served his family, profession and community with distinction.

The Field

Robert E. Yetter Memorial Field will be a first-class facility used primarily for local Teener Baseball, and will be built on an existing field in use at the Vernon C. Wass Park in Lower Allen Township. The project is a collaborative effort among family, friends, co-workers, youth baseball organizations and members of the community. Lower Allen Township is donating the land and the fencing for the field. Engineering, grading, seeding, planting, construction and equipment still need to be purchased or donated. Approximately \$160,000, will be needed to take the field through all phases to completion. Lighting will be an additional \$150,000.
