DEPARTMENT HEAD:

During the month of November, Captain Crone attended BOC regular and budget meetings, and Department Head meetings. Public Safety Coordination and Public Safety Captains' meetings were also attended. Coffee with a Cop was held on 11/26. Captain Crone presided over the November Pa Police Accreditation Coalition meeting. A year-to-date spending review was performed and those items still in need of purchase were assigned for acquisition. Public Safety personnel visited PA American Water's facility for a safety walk-through. Specialized assignment review was completed.

Captain Crone assisted Mechanicsburg and Upper Allen PDs at an exercise for Mechanicsburg School District administrative staff. Playing the role of irate parent, Captain Crone was able to help drill response for district personnel and police alike.

The No-shave/Nifty Nails November campaign was a success, with over \$2500 raised for Pink Hands of Hope. Moving into December, the campaign continues with money raised going to FirstDescent. We expect to be back to "normal" grooming standards for January.

Several officers were worthy of nomination for Patrol Officer of the Month for November, but it was Ofc Rennie's act of leadership and courage on "the battlefield" that pushed him to the top.

On 11-13-19 at 0039 hrs., Officers Rennie, Shiley, and Boldosser responded to New Cumberland Borough to assist with an active domestic where a gun had been fired. As they arrived on-scene, they were immediately met with gunfire. They sought cover, and Ofc. Shiley ended up pinned down behind a vehicle directly in front of the residence where the suspect was firing from. Ofc Rennie took charge of the situation and directed resources where he needed them. Ofc Rennie formulated a plan to get Ofc Shiley to safety. As Ofc Rennie directed other officers to withdraw from their current locations to a safer location, he employed tactics such as bound and overwatch, to ensure all officers were moving to safety while having their withdrawing path covered. None of the officers, nor the suspect, were injured during this extended incident. This is large and in part due to Ofc Rennie's quick thinking and leadership under fire. All the officers sacrificed their own safety to help the New Cumberland officers as well as the victim and neighbor, but Officer Rennie's performance stands out.

NALOXONE

There were no Naloxone administrations by police personnel in Lower Allen Township this month.

The Lower Allen Twp. Police Dept. (LATPD) had 1,258 dispatched calls for service from Cumberland County Communications in November 2019. Of those calls, 67 were UCR related.

During the month of November 2019, LATPD made arrests or filed criminal charges on 47 individuals, issued 12 non-traffic citations, 157 traffic citations, 141 warnings, and 25 parking tickets.

There were 54 crashes reported to LATPD in November 2019. Of those 54 crashes, 12 were reportable crashes and 42 were non-reportable crashes.

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The staff continues to work hard and is dedicated to moving forward in a positive manner to ensure all aspects of Emergency Medical Services are delivered efficiently and effectively with the highest possible quality of care. The cooperation and effort of the staff is greatly appreciated.

Safety is and will be the primary focus. Risk areas are being assessed and strategies to reduce future risk are being developed for implementation in the future.

Teamwork, and Integration within the Public Safety Department continues to improve with EMS personnel participating in two vehicle rescue trainings in November. Positive feedback was received from the staff.

In November an emphasis was placed on implementing new ideas and concepts based on conferences and seminars attended in October. The primary area of development is peer review quality assurance for the purposes of documentation. This process provides an improved distribution of work and most importantly allows all EMS staff to understand the importance and need for accuracy in documentation. The process is in development and will take a few months to be fully implemented.

One of the highest risk management concerns in EMS is, Patient Refusals. A patient refusal occurs when 911 is requested and EMS personnel contact a patient. The patient then decides to not seek further medical care. In November a Patient Refusal Focused Performance Improvement program was implemented. The program involves the review of all patients who refused care. All patient refusals are reviewed by a senior paramedic. Attempts are made to contact the patient and speak with them to ensure they were satisfied with the service they received and have no additional medical concerns. This program also includes public service request such as lift assists.

A long-term technology CAD Import project involving our ESO Electronic Health Care Record vendor and Cumberland County Communications was completed and implemented in November. The completion of this project allows the information provided by Cumberland County Communication to be automatically imported into the Electronic Health Care Record required for every response. This process reduces the errors associated with data entry and ties together two key components of the documentation process.

Expansion of existing technology capabilities occurred with the PlanIT scheduling software with two new features involving personnel tracking being implemented. EMS is continuing to enhance the use of existing technological resources, such as PowerDMS and Guardian. Use of the existing technological resources improves efficiency and effectiveness in administration and operations. The importance of technology in EMS cannot be overstated.

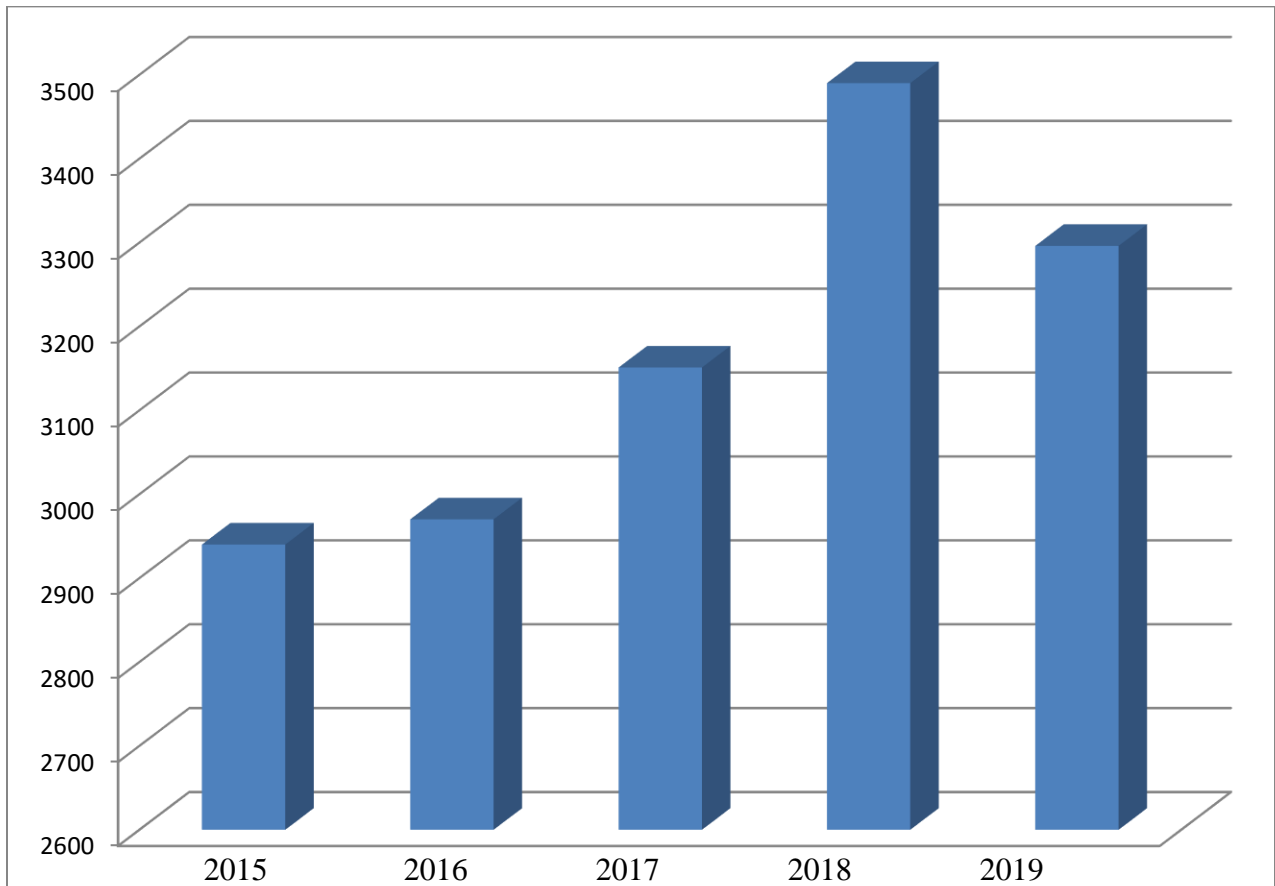
The schedule continues to be successfully managed in a positive direction. The staff has done an excellent job in covering the openings. The staff's hard work and dedication are commendable and greatly appreciated.

Captain Deaven and Director Holl worked with the Cumberland County EMS council and American Ambulance Association of Pennsylvania working to have EMS exempted from HB 1862. HB1862 is a hastily crafted bill in response to surprise billing. Currently the bill has not moved and is not anticipated to move before Christmas.

All the Staff, Captain Deaven, and Director Holl continue to work on new ideas and concepts to deliver the highest possible quality of care and continuous improvement for EMS operations.

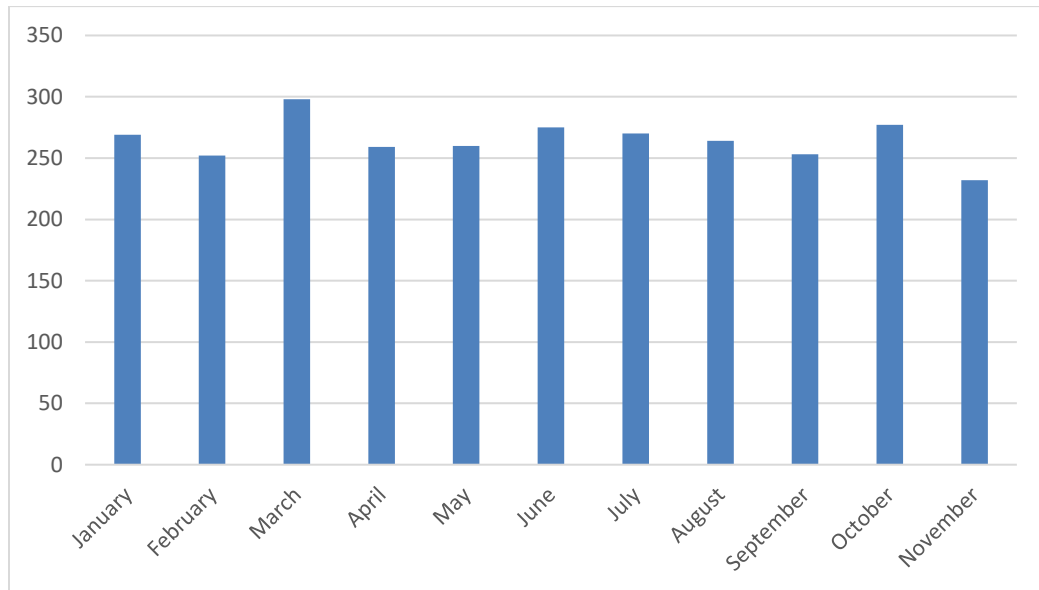

Request for Service 2015 to 2019 YTD

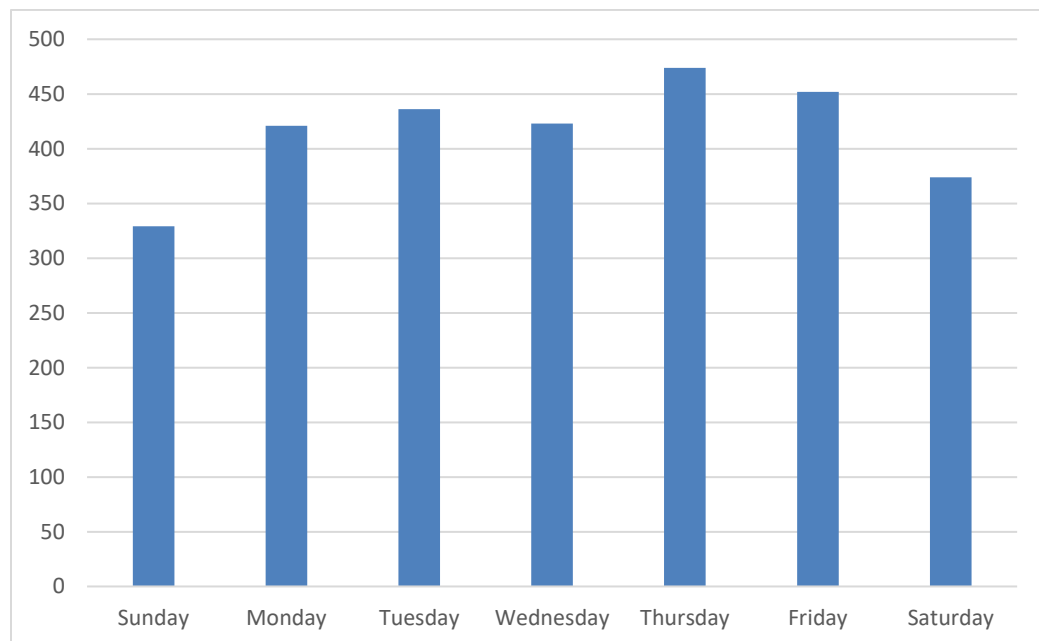

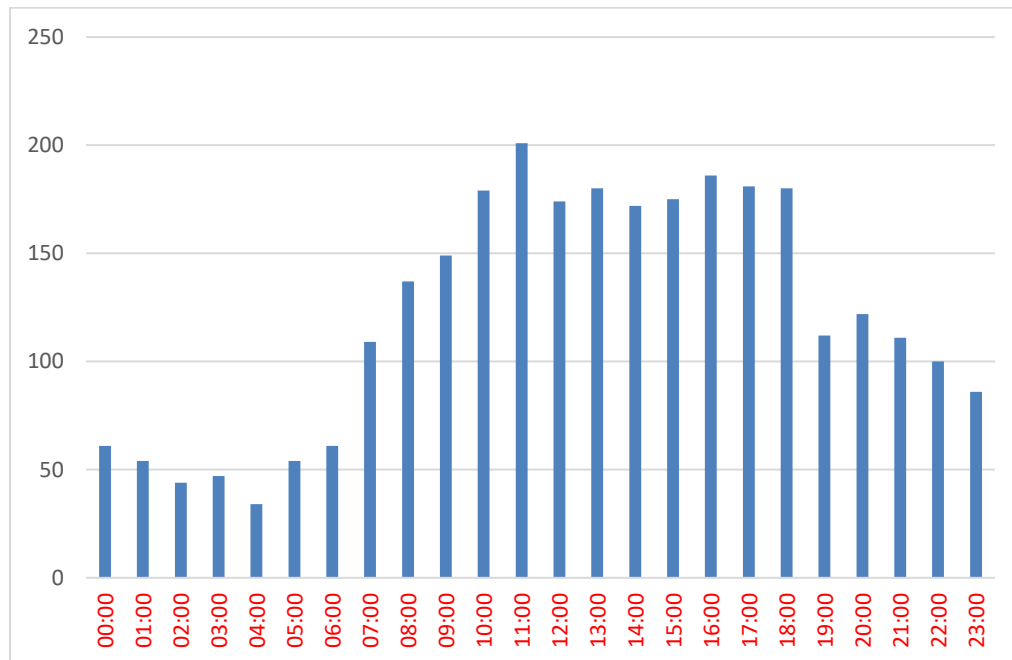
November-Request for Service by Month



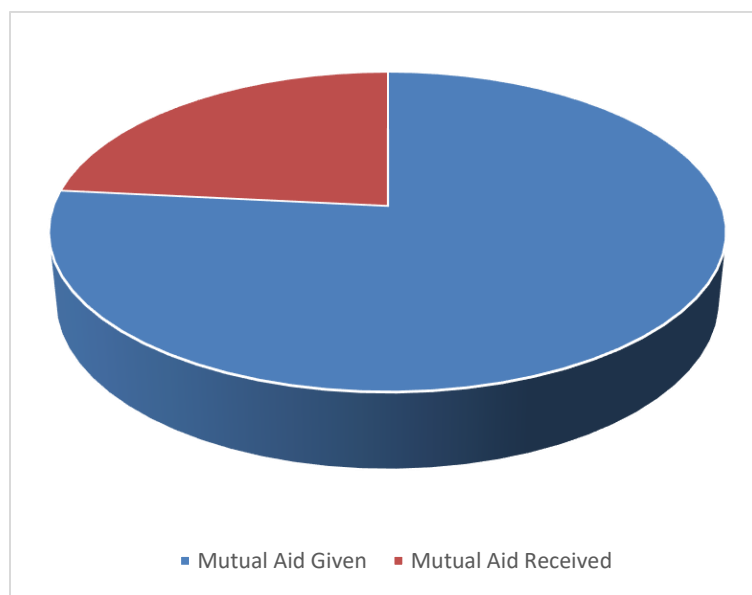
November- Request for Service by Day of the Week

- On Wednesday 11/6/19 Fire Captain Frank Wirth conducted a training session on Forcible Entry at Fire Station #2 using the Blue Door simulator to properly force entry through doors in various configurations using a Halligan Bar and Flat Head Axe.
- On Wednesday 11/20/19 EMS Captain Tony Deaven, PSO Justin Kettering, and PSO Keegan Toot conducted a training session on Vehicle Rescue Operations with Fire and EMS personnel. The class covered the integrated operations of Fire/Rescue personnel and EMS providers on the techniques and equipment to accomplish this in the field.
- On Wednesday 11/27/19 EMS Captain Tony Deaven and PSO Justin Kettering conducted a training session on Vehicle Rescue Operations with Fire and EMS personnel. This class involved practical evolutions with the operation of the litters on the ambulances and basic packaging or movement of patients to the ambulance. Also, vehicle extrication operations were conducted with a patient in the vehicle using hydraulic and other powered rescue tools.
