Department of Public Safety



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The Department of Public Safety continues to move forward in our mission to provide for the safest community possible through service to our residents and visitors.

Tuesday, October 1st – Prepared final documents for the Ad Hoc Committee meeting during the day and moderated the Committee meeting held at ‘Flinchy’s Board Room’ (The Old Twp Municipal Board meeting room). The final Report was approved by the Committee members attending at this meeting. This meeting, as all others, were advertised and open to the public.

Wednesday, October 2nd – Worked to develop the Ad Hoc Committee Report ‘Final Draft’.

Thursday, October 3rd – Worked to develop the Ad Hoc Report ‘Final Draft’ during the day and attended the Lisburn Fire Company monthly meeting in the evening.

Friday, October 4th – Worked to continue to develop the Ad Hoc Report ‘Final Draft’ during the day.

Monday, October 7th – Delivered Ambulance 3-74 to Glick to have the SEON 360 driver observation system installed in the unit. These systems allow the driver camera views of all sides of the vehicle during travel on roadways and in parking areas enhancing operator and vehicle safety.

In the afternoon participated in a discussion with the Finance Director and manager concerning options to provide for a financial analysis of the EMS incident report and billing process by a third-party consultant. Director Grove was to develop an RFP for potential vendors.

In the evening presented the FINAL Report of the Public Safety Ad Hoc Committee to the Board for review and approval.

Tuesday, October 8th – Out of the Office.

Wednesday, October 9th – Attended the South-Central Task Force Criminal Justice Subcommittee in the morning and then met with Capt. Deaven and Capt. Wirth to review and discuss expenditures of budgets to date.

In the evening attended the LA Fire Company meeting in the EOC.

Thursday, October 10th – In the morning reviewed budget submission items and in the afternoon picked up Ambulance 3-74 at Glick with Capt. Deaven.

Friday, October 11th – Continued budget submission work and met with Capt. Crone on the PD budget.

Monday, October 14th – Met with the Manager in the morning and continued budget development in the afternoon.

In the evening attended the Board of Commissioners meeting.

Tuesday, October 15th – Attended the Department Head meeting in the morning and then continued 2020 budget submission work in the afternoon.

Wednesday, October 16th – Attended the Cumberland County Chiefs of Police Association meeting in the morning and worked on the Public Safety Budget submission in the afternoon.

In the evening attended the LA Fire Mandatory Inservice Fire Training for drivers.

Thursday, October 17th – Continued final budget submissions drafting in the morning and then participating in a meeting to discuss applicants to the Cumberland County DA's Office Major Case Task Force. The MCTF would be implemented at the request of any County Chief/Director when a 'major' case occurred, and additional investigative personnel are required. An MOU/Agreement has been drafted and department can voluntarily assign personnel. The administrative function would be managed by the County Detective's Chief, but the local Agency Having Jurisdiction (AHJ) would remain in control. Examples of these cases could be homicides, sexual assaults, major burglaries, shooting incidents, abductions, etc., where the local jurisdiction does not have the staff or expertise to fully investigate the event. The MCTF is implemented at the request of the local department who wishes to utilize its services.

In the afternoon conducted a Final Budget Review with staff.

Friday, October 18th – Continued further budget adjustments and attended an initial planning meeting for the Capital City Mall Exercise in fall of 2020.

Monday, October 21st – Worked on final budget presentation PPT during the day and in the evening made the final Public Safety Budget presentation with the Public Safety Staff.

Tuesday, October 22nd – Attended the PWW 360 billing conference at Hershey Lodge.

Wednesday, October 23rd – Attended the PWW 360 billing conference at Hershey Lodge again in the morning.

Thursday, October 24th – Worked on the Public Safety Monthly reports in the afternoon.

Friday, October 25th – Attended the Director's meeting in the morning.

Monday, October 28th – Met with the Manager in the morning and then worked on the Fire Funds Budget presentation in the afternoon.

Tuesday, October 29th – Attended the Department Head meeting in the morning and continued the Fire Funds PPT presentation development in the afternoon.

Wednesday, October 30th – Worked on the Fire Funds PPT presentation.

Thursday, October 31st – Drafted the New residents Workshop PPT for Public Safety.

DEPARTMENT HEAD:

During the month of October, Captain Crone attended BOC Meetings, the final Public Safety Ad Hoc meeting, and Department Head meetings. Public Safety Coordination and Public Safety Captains' meetings were also attended. Coffee with a Cop was held on 10/22. Budget preparation meetings continued. Captain Crone presided over the October Pa Police Accreditation Coalition meeting. A meeting with West Shore School District personnel was held to discuss possible alterations to a walking train. Captain Crone and Corporal Sentman attended a domestic violence victims' vigil in Camp Hill.

The month ended with two campaigns. The first was to garner votes in order to avail ourselves of a K9 grant. As of this writing, we know that the effort fell short, but we will try again next year. The end of October started the second campaign: No-shave/Nifty Nails November. The Police Department is participating in a friendly competition with other local agencies to raise money for Pink Hands of Hope. Facial hair grooming standards are being relaxed, as well as nail polish color restrictions, for the month of November (give or take a few extra days). Employees must donate to participate. Donations from the public are being taken via social media or directly, with all proceeds going to Pink Hands of Hope.

Officer Milletics garnered Patrol Officer of the Month accolades for October.

During the month of October, Ofc Milletics handled 12 UCR investigations, including 6 bank cases that he voluntarily took from Member's 1st fraud department. He has filed charges in 9 of the 12 UCR cases. He also documented 29 traffic stops and handled 54 calls for service, more than anyone else in the department during the month. Some of the details of the criminal investigative matters (unable to be shared in this forum) pushed him to the top.

NALOXONE

There were no Naloxone administrations by police personnel this month.

The focus has been on Safety, Teamwork, and Integration within the Public Safety Department. Improvements are occurring in the focus areas due to the hard work and cooperation of the staff. Everyone's support is greatly appreciated!

EMS personnel completed training on the new ambulance in the first week of October. The new ambulance was placed in service on Monday, October 7, 2019, as scheduled. Staff feedback regarding the new ambulances performance and operational functionality is extremely high.

EMS personnel assisted the Fire Departments and Public Safety Officers with fire prevention education as much as possible during the first two full weeks of October. EMS personnel participated in the annual Halloween events sponsored by the Fire Departments.

Captain Deaven and Director Holl attended the "Rethinking Pennsylvania's Emergency Medical Services" sponsored by Winder University Law School on Friday, October 4, 2019. The seminar combined lectures and panel discussion to provide new viewpoints and perspectives on the future development of EMS in Pennsylvania. Key take-aways included the emphasis on data driven decision making and the importance of technology to eliminate duplication and improve efficiency. EMS must have access to data from every aspect of the system beginning with call in-take and ending with the completion of the revenue recovery cycle. EMS program development, education, and clinical practices should be based on data. EMS leadership must move away from traditional metrics of response time and shift the focus to clinical outcomes and patient impact.

Captain Deaven and Director Holl attended the annual ABC 360 conference which is provided by the local Page, Wolfberg and Wirth (PWW) Law firm in Hershey on October 21st, 22nd and 23rd. PWW is the national leader in EMS law. The conference provides education and best practices for EMS leadership and EMS revenue recovery. The EMS Leadership portion of the conference stressed the importance of data driven decisions, deemphasizing traditional metrics, and shifting focus to clinical outcomes and patient impact. The revenue recovery portion of the conference provided updates on challenges with revenue recovery and how to maximize efficiencies and revenue received. Education for the staff is being developed based on the information obtained from the conference.

EMS is continuing to enhance the use of existing technological resources, such as PowerDMS, Guardian, PlanIT and ESO continue to be developed and leveraged to improve efficiency and effectiveness. Captain Deaven was provided an overview of the Guardian tracking software by Executive Assistant Dianna Knisley to provide a reliable method of tracking the performance of EMS staff.

The schedule continues to be successfully managed in a positive direction aimed at reducing the need for outside assistance. The staff has done an excellent job in covering the openings. The staff's hard work and dedication are commendable and greatly appreciated.

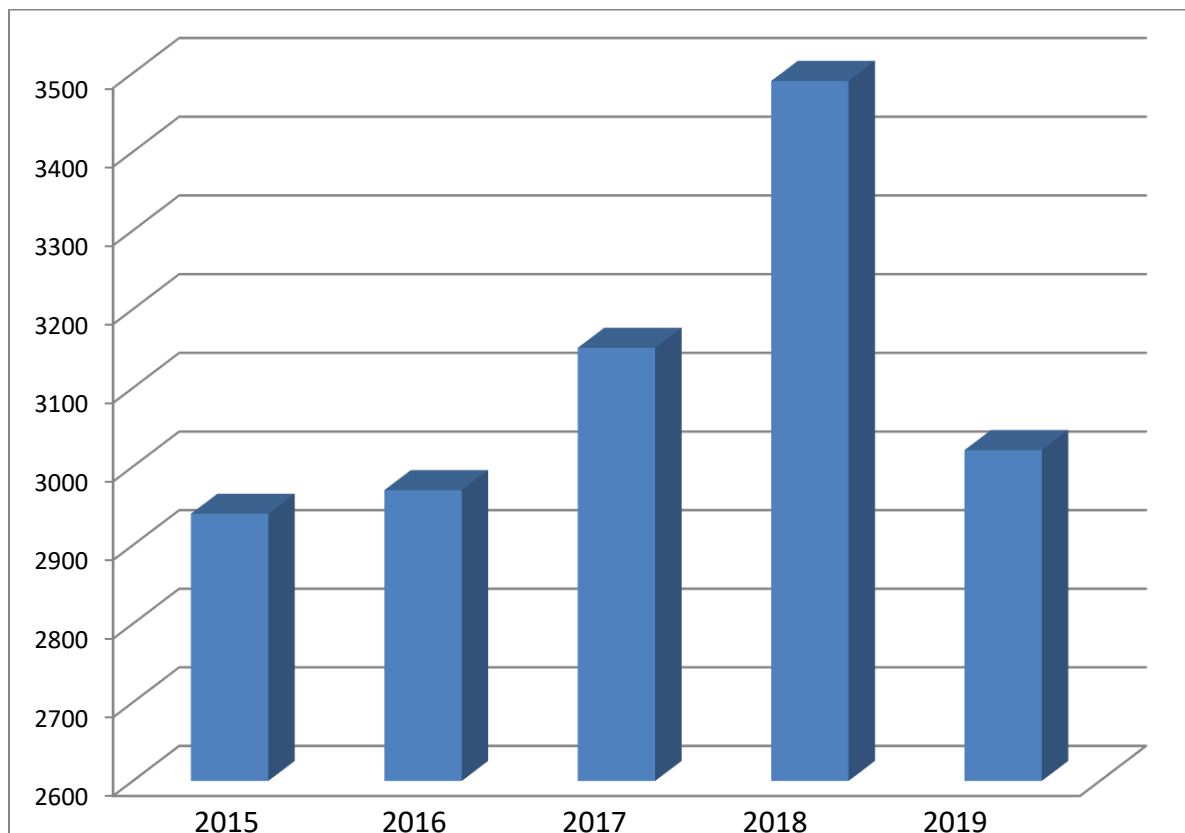

All staff, Captain Deaven, and Director Holl continue to work on new ideas and concepts to deliver the highest possible quality of care and continuous improvement for EMS operations.

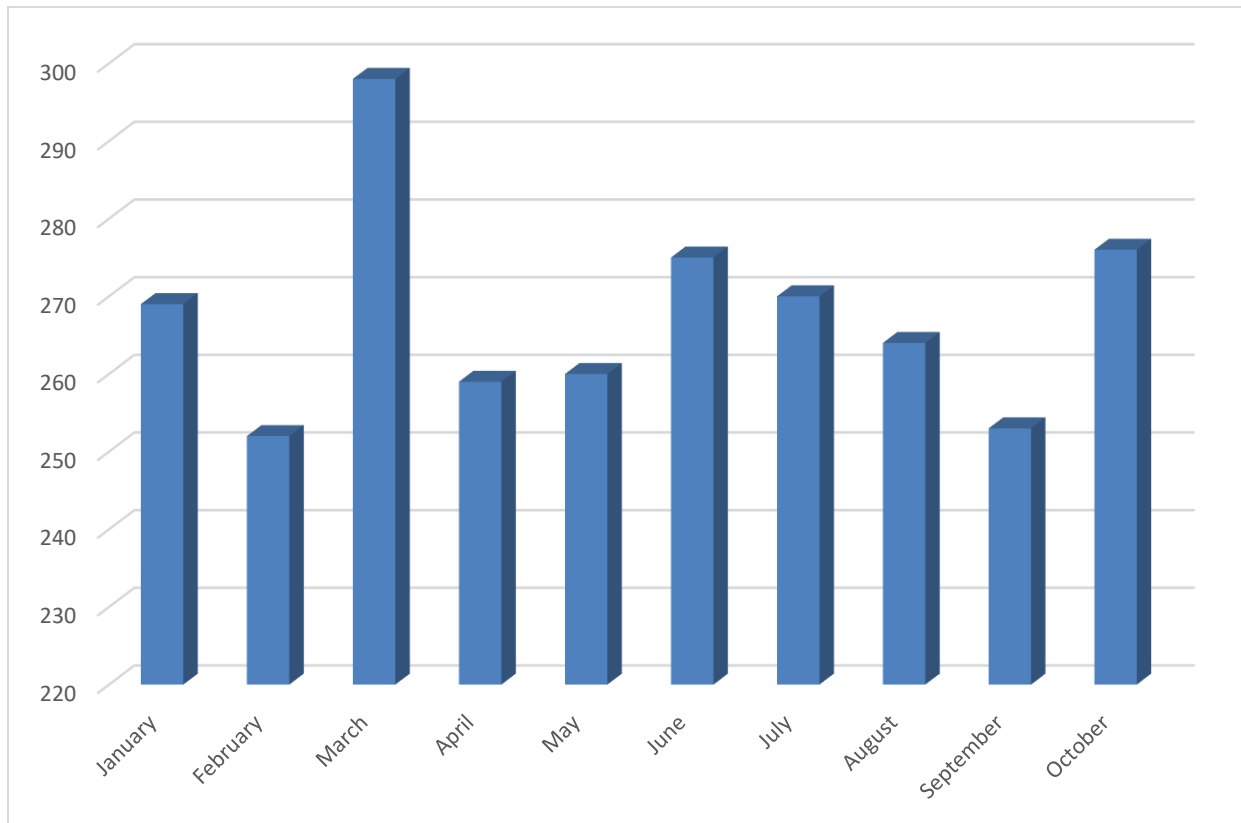

Request for Service 2015 to 2019 YTD

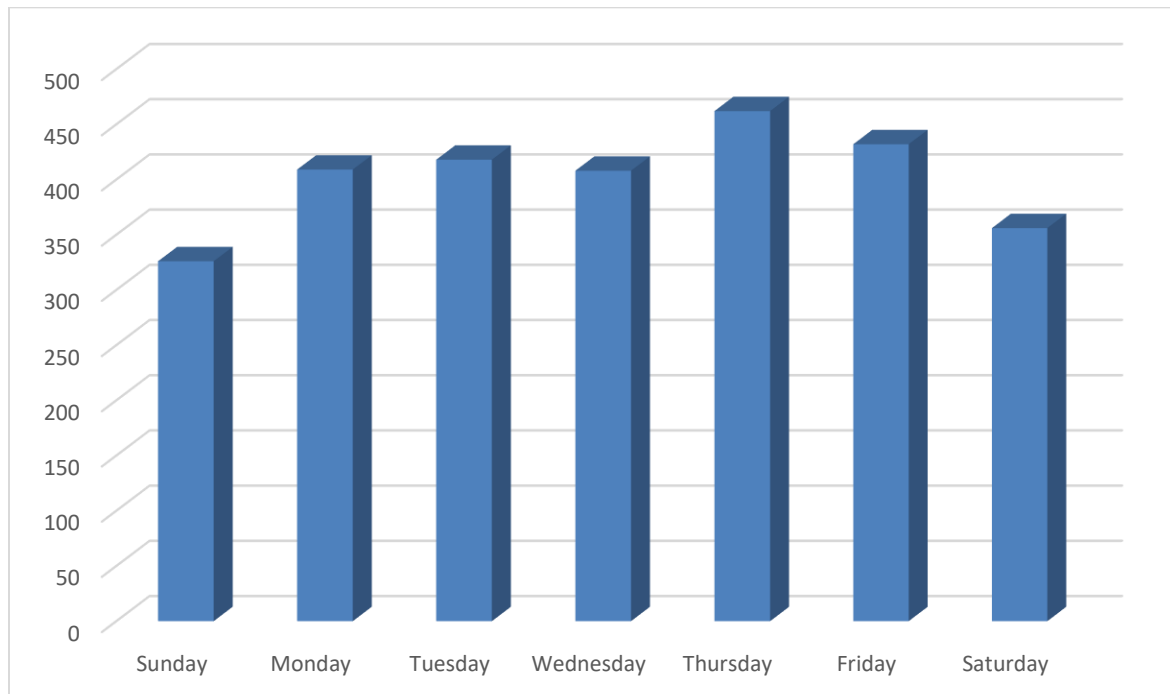

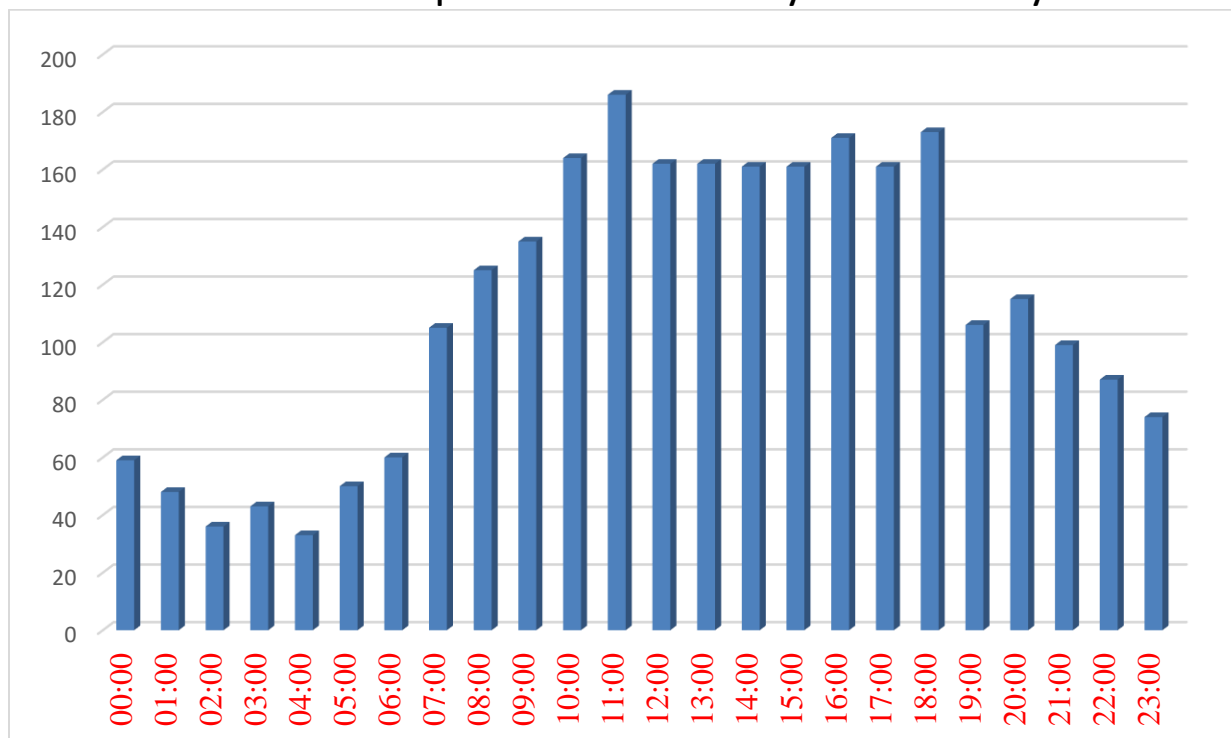
October-Request for Service by Month



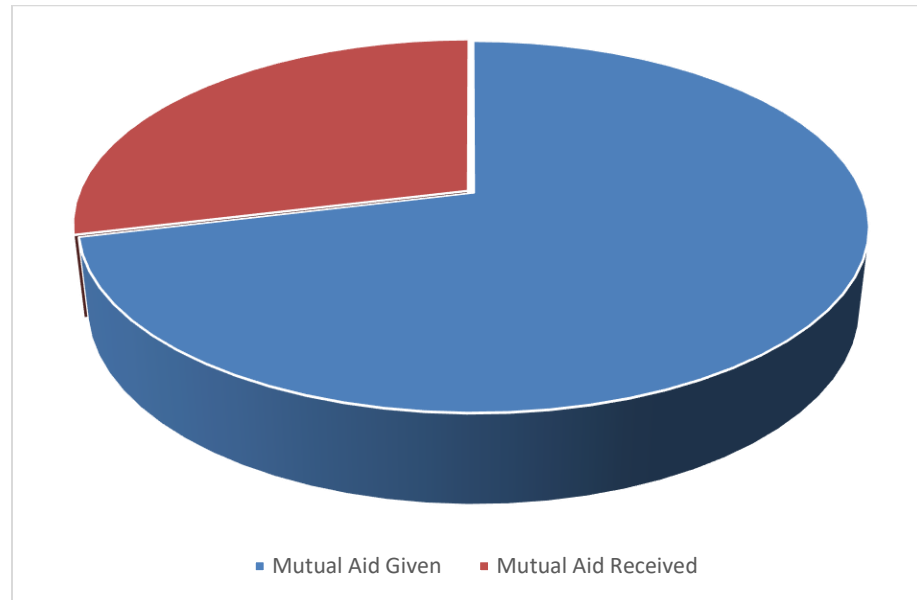
October- Request for Service by Day of the Week

On the early morning of 10/21/19 Lower Allen Fire Company and Lisburn Fire Company responded to a structure fire on 612 Whitetail Drive in Fairview Township. Crews assisted with providing manpower for fire attack, overhaul, and ventilation of the structure. The structure was a total loss.

Live-In Firefighter Activities:

- Firefighter Bob Yeagley responded to 42 Incidents during the month.
- Firefighter Caleb Hasenhauer responded to 47 Incidents during the month.

Fire Prevention Week Activities:

This year's fire prevention activities were modified this year to include EMS so that we could provide a full fire and life safety education to the children in the three elementary schools and preschools in the community. In coordination with the principals at Lower Allen/Rossmoyne Elementary and Highland Elementary Schools a program was developed with four fire/life safety education stations with the students rotating every 15 minutes. The stations consisted of discussions/presentations on injury prevention (EMS), exit drills in the home, knowing your address, calling 911, knowing what to do if there is a fire in your home, and stop/drop/roll.

Fire department apparatus was on display (Squad 12 and Truck 12), and a demonstration of Firefighter Personal Protective Equipment was conducted. The use of Fairview Township Fire Department's Fire Prevention Trailer for a second year was very useful in demonstrating fire prevention techniques to the children. While fire prevention week is the week in which October 9th falls, it has been customary for Lower Allen to also extend it into the following week to get all preschools done.
