

The Department of Public Safety continues to move forward in our mission to provide for the safest community possible through service to our residents and visitors. We are looking forward with implementing some outstanding programs thanks to the budget approved by the Board for 2019.

Wednesday, May 1st – Various administrative tasks completed.

Thursday, May 2nd – Attended the seminar “Hacking the Hacker” presented by 3rd Element Computer, the Twp.’s IT vender, in the morning.

In the afternoon attended the Emergency Health Services federation inspection of the three EMS ambulances at Station 1. All units passed and the EMS license was referred to the state Dept. of health for approval.

Friday, May 3rd – Attended the Alpine software implementation project working group meeting in the morning. Also met with Donna Paul and drafted the Pinnacle contract cancellation letter to be signed by the Manager.

Monday, May 6th – 1st day for Justin Strawser the new part-time Public Safety Planner – met with him in the morning to discuss the agenda and work products he will be developing in his role. These include but are not limited to: (1) The Cedar Cliff HS exercise scheduled for August (2) The EOP rewrite (3) The 2020 Capital City Mall Exercise.

In the afternoon met with Bill Fox concerning quotes for the EMS Lifepaks and the CPR device. Then attended the police supervisor’s meeting.

In the evening participated in the Public Safety Ad Hoc Committee meeting in the EOC.

Tuesday, May 7th – During the Day did final prep for the TMI Exercise. In the evening participated in that exercise.

Wednesday, May 8th – In the morning participated in a PT EMT interview. In the afternoon attended a CD Staff Meeting and then met at CLA to discuss a date and location at the facility for a future Ad Hoc Committee meeting.

Participated in a Capt. Command Staff introductory meeting with Tony, then attended a welcome reception for him in EMS.

In the afternoon conducted an orientation meeting with Tony covering various EMS topics and agenda items for tasks that need to be completed by the July 1st start date for LA EMS ALS.

In the evening attended the Board of Commissioner's meeting.

Wednesday, May 15th – Capt. Deaven and I met with Barry Albertson to discuss the transition of ALS from Life Team to LA. Conducted an EMS Budget review in the afternoon with Capt. Deaven.

Thursday, May 16th – Attended a Task Force Exercise Working Group meeting at Lancaster County Public Safety Training Center. Discussed the LA DPS Cedar Cliff exercise being planned for August.

Friday, May 17th – Attended the Cumberland County Law Enforcement Memorial Service for Police Week in the morning. The attended the Cumberland County Chief of Police meeting at Cumberland County DPS.

In the evening, attended the Cumberland County Chiefs Annual Recognition Dinner.

Saturday, May 18th – Attended the Lisburn Tanker Housing Ceremony in the morning at Lisburn Co 24 station.

Monday, May 20th – Participated in the initial Cedar Cliff planning meeting in the morning, then met with Justin and Erin concerning Twp. GIS platform and Public Safety applications and access.

For lunch attended the annual EMS Appreciation luncheon sponsored by the Emergency Health Services Federation at their officer in Fairview Twp.

In the evening participated in the Ad Hoc Committee meeting at Lisburn Community Fire Company.

Tuesday, May 21st – In the morning completed the March/April monthly reports and for lunch attended the EMS Appreciation luncheon in EMS.

In the afternoon met with Capt. Deaven and Dr Modi to discuss his interest in serving at LA EMS Medical Director.

Wednesday, May 22nd – Attended the EHSF EMS Leadership breakfast at the Central Hotel and Conference Center in Harrisburg.

In the afternoon attended a meeting with residents from the Cliffs organized by Twp. Engineer Dan Flint concerning some traffic issues they had at Cedar Cliff Dr and Olmstead Way.

In the evening attended a reception hosted by PA American Water at their new headquarters.

Thursday, May 23rd – Attended a fire drill with Capt. Wirth at Bethany Village as a part of their test of resident evacuations within the facility.

Friday, May 24th – Out of the office.

Monday, May 27th – MEMORIAL DAY HOLIDAY.

Tuesday, May 28th – In the morning met with the Twp. manager.

In the afternoon attended a training session for the updated COBRA MS records sharing software. This is the Cumberland-Dauphin node being expanded to be a part of the Super COBRA sharing network.

Wednesday, May 29th – Participated in Paramedic interviews in the morning for full-time positions.

Thursday, May 30th – Held a second round of interviews for the full time and part-time Paramedic positions.

Friday, May 31st – Attended a Township Director's meeting in the morning and a Microsoft E3 License meeting in the afternoon.

DEPARTMENT HEAD:

During the month of April, Captain Crone attended a Police Supervisors' Meeting, two Public Safety Ad Hoc Committee meetings, the TMI exercise, a uniform committee meeting, a meeting with the school administrators for the township-based WSSD schools, a Public Safety Coordination Meeting, an exercise planning meeting, a meeting with Cliffs residents regarding traffic issues, a Pa American Water open house, Coffee with a Cop, the EMS Captain welcome luncheon, a Board of Commissioners meeting, training in the former Borders Books, Hampden Township PD's oral board (initial hiring), and automated license plate reader admin training. Captain Crone also presided over the monthly PPAC meeting.

The first annual CALEA compliance check was conducted this month. Issues were minimal and the process relatively painless, due in no small part to the preparation assistance of Julie Echterling.

Patrol Officer of the Month honors go to Ofc. Michael Scarlato. During the month of May, Ofc. Scarlato handled 6 UCR cases. Of those, one was a seizure of cocaine on a traffic stop which also resulted in a DUI charge. Another was a retail theft of baby formula at Walmart involving four suspects out of Philadelphia who were arrested on scene. In that case, Ofc. Scarlato was able to solve two similar open cases in two other jurisdictions through follow-up interviews with the suspect. He was also able to determine the suspects had been in our Walmart previously in the month, that time stealing \$1,453.58 worth of merchandise.

Ofc Scarlato has also been assisting in the investigation of a theft of a \$13,899 ring from Zale's by researching a very large quantity of license plate data. There is a similar open case in Frederick, MD, with no viable leads. In going above and beyond with these investigations, Ofc Scarlato has shown a level of thoroughness that has benefitted victims and law enforcement agencies both within and outside of Lower Allen township, and it's worthy of recognition.

May was a month of transition. The new EMS Captain, Tony Deaven, started on Monday, May 13, 2019. The initial focus is the implementation of Advanced Life Support Services on July 1, 2019. Beyond the ALS implementation focus is an assessment of every aspect of the EMS Division, with emphasis on improved team work and intergration within the Public Safety Department.

Supervisors Hivner and Calaman are focusing on their assigned tasks and providing invaluable institutional knowledge to Captain Deaven.

EMT Beishline continues to coordinate EMS continuing education. Additionally, she has assigned a summer safety series using social media as a community outreach project. Positive feedback has been received, as well increased social media following. EMT Beshline completed her part of the iPad implementation project. Implementation of the iPads will occur in late June or early July.

We continue to integrate part-time providers into the schedule in order to provide a robust delivery of services and staff EMS vehicles to the maximum, considering the days and times of service demands. Interviews for part-time EMTs were completed and new part-time staff is contributing to EMS operations.

Interviews for full-time and part-time paramedics were completed and candidates selected to fill as many positions as possible. The applicants are highly qualified with exceptional experience. The experience and qualifications will benefit the citizens of Lower Allen Township.

Director Holl and Captain Deaven continue to work on new ideas and concepts to deliver the highest possible quality of care and continuous improvement for EMS operations.

Director Holl and Captain Deaven met with Dr. Rupen Modi from UPMC Pinnacle regarding the critical position of EMS Medical Director. The meeting and follow-up conversations have been very positive.

The data points collected and analyzed will be refined over the next 3-4 months to ensure the delivery of EMS services is being provided at the highest level and meeting the expectations of our residents.

“Missed Calls” are high priority and in depth analysis of the data to determine the leading causes will be completed by the end of the summer. EMT Supervisor Calaman has been tracking those statistics and a copy of her report is attached.


Based on the initial evaluation the most beneficial option is implementation of an ALS squad “chase truck” environment with the current Captain’s vehicle. This increases the flexibility and helps to reduce the impact of the Lower Allen Township ALS provider responding to requests for service outside of Lower Allen Township. A complete analayis and development of solutions will be completed by early fall.

We continue to explore is the addition of Advanced EMTs (A-EMT). Providers with this certification can perform certain higher level skills, including IV administration and limited drug therapies under certain circumstances. State and regional protocols, and dispatch criteria, will need to be adjusted to make this level of certification an operational reality. An adjustment to the salary matrix would also be required if we were to implement this option. Currently, Marie Calaman and Ashley Beishline are certified as Advanced EMT's.

EMS transitioned to a new uniform on June 1, 2019. Postive feedback has been received. We are also examining high visibilty outerwear for all staff to ensure their safety while working on and around roadways.

A complete assessment of all aspects of Emergency Medical Services and the delivery model is on-going and opportunites for improvement are being developed. The goal is to provide the highest quality of service and expand service delivery into non-tradional area to improve overall health and well-being of our community.

The following pages contain tables that provide an overall summary perspective of the monthly calls for EMS service. As is clearly evident, EMS continues to be very busy and steady on a daily basis.





Lower Allen Fire Company and Lisburn Community Fire Company personnel attended the following training:

- On Wednesday 5/1/19 PSO Bryce Landis conducted a training class on vehicle rescue techniques. Participants went over proper stabilization of vehicles and extrication techniques, such as door removal, dash lifts, and roof removal.
- On Wednesday 5/1/19 and Saturday 5/4/19 an Aerial Apparatus Operations Class was conducted through HACCC. The instructor was State Fire Suppression Instructor Ed Mezinko. This class discussed types of aerial apparatus, features and function of aerial apparatus, positioning of aerial apparatus, and tactical operations. Hands-on aerial operations were conducted at Cedar Cliff High School on Saturday of the class.
- On Wednesday 5/15/19 Assistant Chief Chris Trace conducted SCBA confidence course training at Fire Station #1. This training was designed to improve confidence and familiarity with the SCBA and recognized search techniques.

- On Wednesday 5/22/19 training was conducted at the Bon Ton. Participants were broken into two groups. One group focused on Engine Company Operations with the crew doing run-ins with Squad 12 performing hose-line deployments and pump operations. A second crew conducted aerial apparatus operations with outrigger deployment and flying the aerial ladder at the rear of the Bon Ton.

On 5/3/19 Fire Captain Frank Wirth completed a weeklong training course on the Active Attack Integrated Response (Active Shooter) conducted by ALERRT of Texas State University and sponsored by the South-Central Task Force. Captain Wirth will be training Public Safety personnel, including our own personnel, on Incident Command, Emergency Medical Care, and Rescue Task Forces.

On 5/3/19, 5/10/19, 5/17/19, and 5/31/19 meetings were conducted on the Alpine RedNMX Software Implementation Project for Lower Allen Fire Company, Lisburn Fire Company, Lower Allen Public Safety, and Lower Allen Fire Codes with the following in attendance: Public Safety Director Dave Holl, LAFC Fire Chief Dave Murdoch, LCFC Fire Chief Frank Williamson, LAFC Assistant Chief Chris Trace, Fire Captain Frank Wirth, Fire Inspector Bill Yeagley, and PSO Bryce Landis. The NFIRS Fire Report Module is complete and work is being done on the Inventory Modules for equipment, SCBA, and Hose. Fire Inspector Yeagley is coordinating the development of forms and documents for codes inspections in the Alpine Software.

On 5/3/16, 5/13/19, and 5/30/19 Lower Allen Fire Chief Dave Murdoch, Lisburn Fire Chief Frank Williamson, and Fire Captain Frank Wirth met to develop an outline and presentation for the upcoming Ad Hoc Committee fire presentations in May and June.

On 5/11/18 PSO Bryan Dunbar and Corporal Ed Curtis attended a Public Safety Career Day at Cumberland-Perry Area Vo-Tech School to present information to students on the career fields of Police Officer, Public Safety Officer, Firefighter, and Emergency Medical Services.

On 5/13-15/19 Hose Testing was conducted for Lower Allen Fire Company and Lisburn Community Fire Company. A couple of sections did fail during inspection and were replaced with hose from hose storage. Replacement fire hose will be budgeted for 2020.

On Thursday 5/23/19 Public Safety Director Holl and Fire Captain Wirth attended and observed an evacuation drill at Bethany West. This is a continued effort to coordinate with Bethany West personnel on response planning in the event of an emergency incident with a response from Lower Allen Township Public Safety personnel and resources.

On 5/28/19 Fire Captain Wirth coordinated with Col. Diminick and Sgt. Sullivan at Cedar Cliff High School to present the Lower Allen Firefighter Recruitment Program to the Junior ROTC students. The presentation highlighted the need for volunteers, Live-in opportunities, educational opportunities, and how to become a Firefighter and/or EMT with Lower Allen Fire, Lisburn Fire, and Lower Allen EMS. The presentation was given to each of the four grades that day.

On Tuesday afternoon and evening 5/7/19 the Lower Allen Township EOC was activated and Township Personnel participated in the TMI Exercise. The exercise was observed by PEMA personnel and was a success. Lower Allen Fire Company perform Route Evacuation Notification in Beacon Hill and Allendale developments.

On Saturday 5/18/19 Lisburn Community Fire Company held a housing dedication for the New Tanker 24. Commissioners Black, Holtzman and Villone, along with Representative Sheryl Delozier all spoke at the housing. All present at the dedication were asked to help “push” the new Tanker into the station.
