DEPARTMENT HEAD:

During the month of March, Captain Crone presided over the monthly PA Police Accreditation Coalition meeting and attended the police supervisors' meeting. Captain Crone was unable to attend the Board of Commissioners' meetings but did attend one Department Head meeting. Captain Crone attended PELRAS training (labor relations) and the PLEAC conference (partly as a student and partly on leave as an instructor).

Captain Crone participated in preparation for the Ad Hoc Committee meetings, helping to set structure and agendas.

Captain Crone attended both Lisburn and LA Fire banquets (2/23 and 3/2) as a guest and was honored to be present as our volunteers were recognized for their service throughout the year.

March 18th was the "go-live" for our new CRIMEWATCH platform. Select arrests, warrants, and open cases now push to the website www.lowerallencops.com, as well as our Facebook and Twitter accounts. Tips rolled in almost instantly and within a week, a CRIMEWATCH tip was used to solve a case. We have high expectations for this platform and so far, it has been performing well.

The Cumberland County Police Testing Consortium physical agility and written exams were held on 3/30 and 3/31. Typically, Captain Crone proctors the written exam, but was unexpectedly called out of town for a family matter and was replaced by Director Holl. Of approximately 150 applicants, only 26 had Act 120 training. After testing, there were only 16 eligible applicants. These applicants will be granted oral interviews in April.

The monthly Coffee with a Cop event was held at Starbucks and was well received.

The stationary license plate reader trial installation planning is underway. The agency was selected as a beta test site for the vendor and will be the first from that group in PA. Lt Thomas is leading the charge on this project.

Patrol Officer of the Month honors go to Officer Katie Justh. Ofc. Justh's handling of two specific incidents this month, is what set her apart. One incident was a case involving a victim from Lower Allen that had his credit card information used to make purchases that were being delivered to a vacant home in Upper Allen Twp. The initial call for this case was taken by another officer who passed the information onto us at shift change, and via email. Ofc. Justh followed up by meeting with Upper Allen officers who were watching the vacant home. She gathered more intelligence, to include a vehicle description with an out of state registration. Within about an hour of receiving that information, County advised that the suspect vehicle had just stopped at the vacant home. Our victim's friend followed the vehicle, and Ofc. Justh stopped it on Rt. 15 North. She calmly conducted a felony stop on the vehicle and gave the suspect clear instructions as how to exit the vehicle. The suspect was taken into custody without incident and subsequently charged.

Ofc. Justh also handled a call for a suicidal subject with a gun at Wesley Park Townhouses. Ofc. Justh ran the scene from the start, with minimal supervisory assistance. Based on the information at hand, she made the decision to have SRT called out. While waiting for them to arrive, she gathered as much intelligence information as she could. She also made the necessary contacts to Command Staff and detectives. When SRT arrived, she met with them at the Command Post, and coordinated the relief of our officers from the inside perimeter positions. Ofc. Justh then joined in with the SRT operation and assisted as needed. Once the individual was confirmed to be deceased, she had the Coroner's office contacted. Ofc. Justh handled this complex and rapidly evolving incident in outstanding fashion.

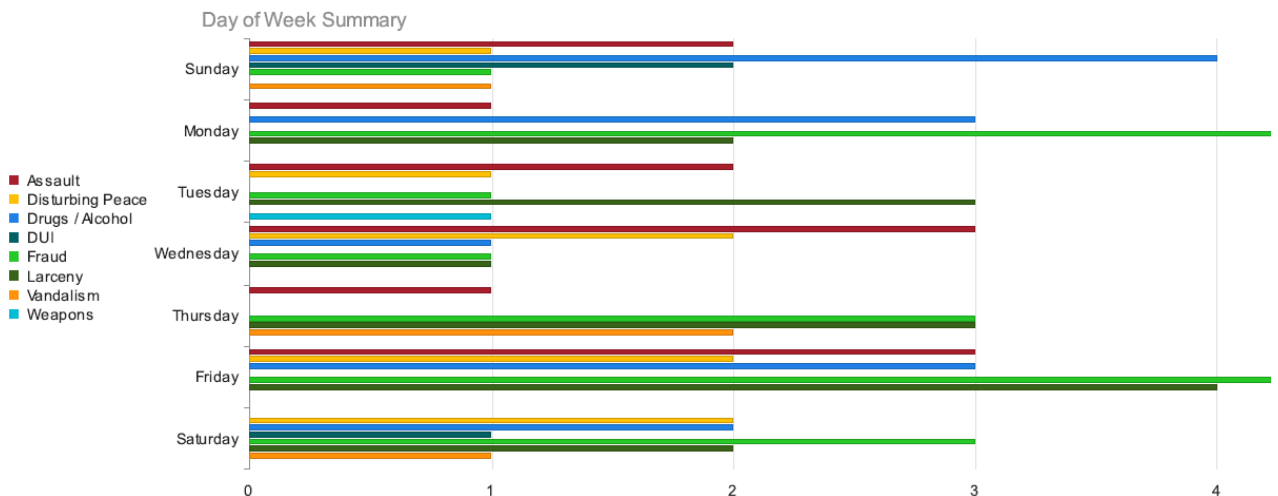

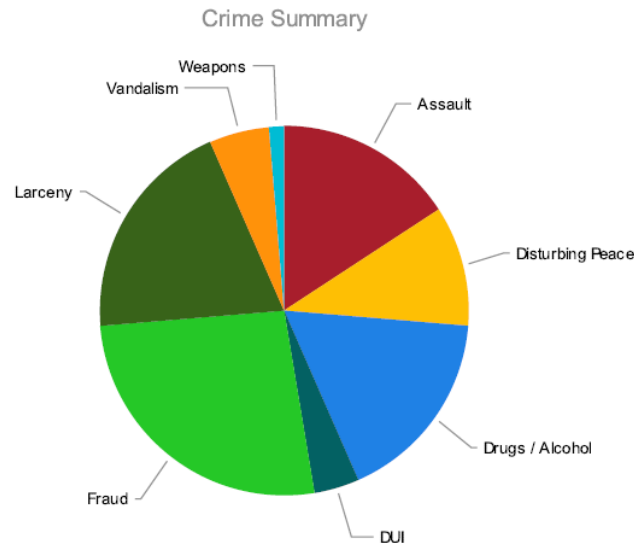

EMS continues ongoing efforts in improvements to organization and service delivery. EMS Supervisors Hiver and Calaman continue to coordinate EMS personnel and operational responsibilities under the Director's oversight.

EMT Beishline continues to develop and coordinate service training. She is also working on the implementation of mobile patient care reporting (PCRs) using iPad devices to access the ESO PCR software. This software is cloud based and partially funded through a region wide grant to the Emergency Health Services Federation (EHSF). We have been advised the current grant ends this summer and there is an ongoing negotiation by EHSF on how to continue funding.

We continue to integrate part-time providers into the schedule in order to provide a robust delivery of services and staff EMS vehicles to the maximum considering the days and times of service demands. Following the Board's action to increase the starting hourly rate for EMT-I part-time positions, a number of applicants have been trained and are now actively being scheduled to assist in delivering EMS services to the community. Additional interviews for part-time staff are pending in April.

The EMS Supervisors continue to meet with the Director on a monthly basis as we work toward a philosophy of continuous improvement for operations and overall EMS processes.

Interviews were conducted this month for EMS Captain. Hopefully that position can be appointed by the Board in March of 2019 to begin the ALS Program implementation.

We continue to examine the content and presentation of the EMS Monthly Report to the Board. Also, we continue to look at management monitoring documents that will assist in that process.

One of the areas we have been looking at is the number of "missed calls" where our ALS or BLS is not available for service calls in the Township and outside EMS units are dispatched instead. This is usually due to one or more of our LA EMS units already being on a call for service. EMT Supervisor Calaman has been tracking those statistics for me. A copy of her report is attached as the last page of this report. As you can clearly see by the numbers, our EMS service missed 44 calls in the Township in March.

A more detailed analysis will be underway to see if those impacts could be mitigated by an additional unit staffing given the days and times of occurrence. One consideration is expanding the hours of coverage and providing a BLS unit overlap shift from 4 p.m. to midnight mainly during the Monday through Saturday time frame. Another option is to maintain two BLS units and run the ALS service in a "chase truck" environment with the Captain's vehicle. The issue often is the call is dispatched ALS with the MICU and upon arrival the patient can be managed BLS. At this point the medic is committed to the call in the MICU despite the downgrade. Splitting the crews would allow for more versatility and flexibility. We will be examining these options during first quarter of 2019.

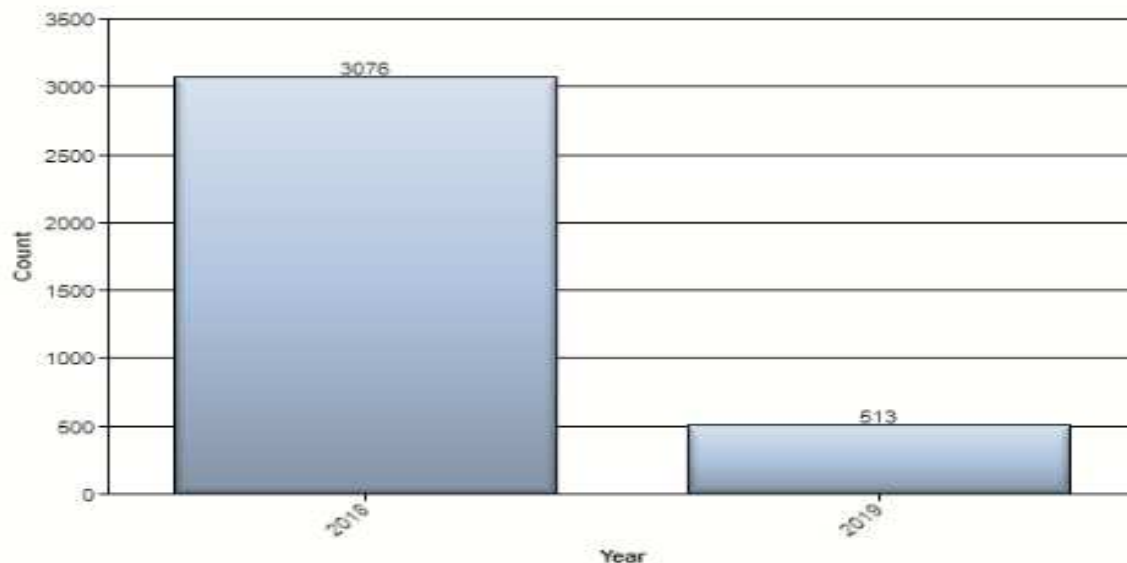

Another area we continue to explore is the addition of Advanced EMTs (A-EMT). Providers with this certification can perform certain higher level skills including IV administration and limited drug therapies under certain circumstances. State and regional protocols, and dispatch criteria, will need to be adjusted to make this level of certification an operational reality. An adjustment to the salary matrix would also be required if we were to implement this option. Currently Marie Calaman and Ashley Beishline are certified as Advanced EMT's.

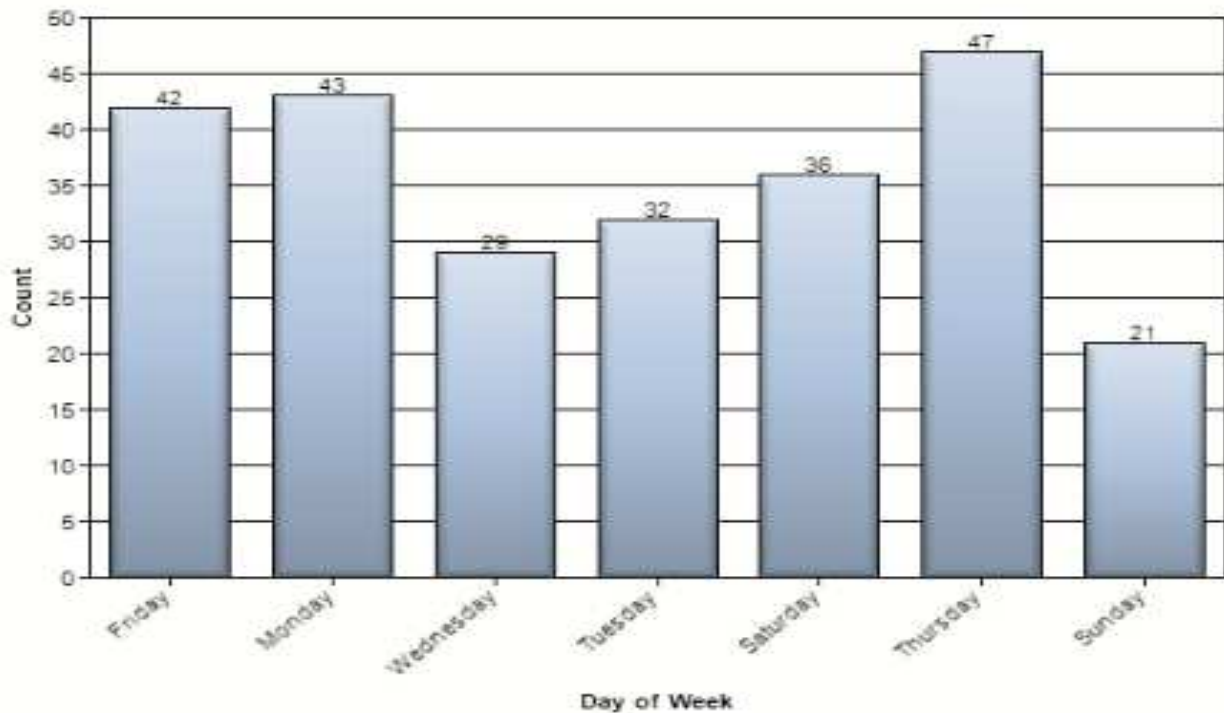
EMS will also be transitioning to new uniforms hopefully in the March/April 2019 timeframe. They will be a more comfortable relaxed uniform shirt but remain well marked as EMS providers from Lower Allen EMS. We are also examining high visibility outwear for all staff so they are highly visible on and around the roadways when they have responded to calls for service.

In 2019 we will continue to be looking at the overall concept of EMS operations as we move forward with service deployment strategies for improved quality of care and fiscal efficiencies.

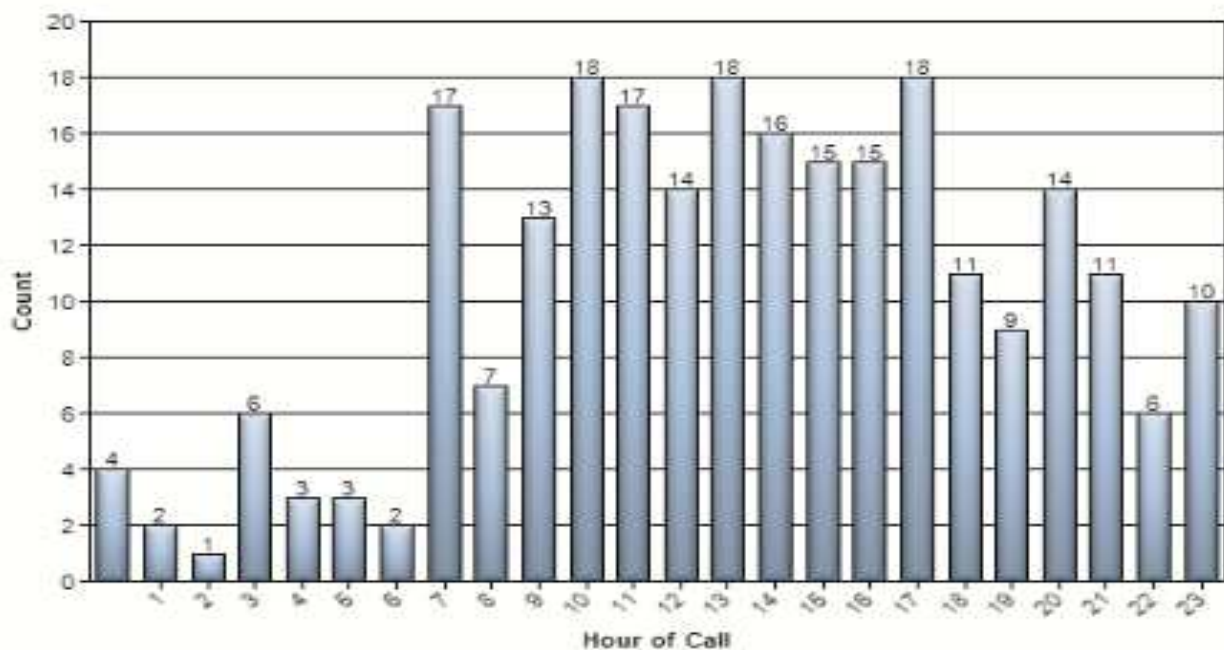
