- 3. Maintenance and repair of the traffic signal shall be accomplished by the Township, through Township personnel, by maintenance contract, or a combination of both. The cost of maintenance and repair, including the value of labor and expenses incurred by Township personnel, shall be submitted to Township by Applicant within 30 days of notice from Township.
- 4. Failure of the Applicant to submit the required reimbursement within the time specified will entitle the Township to avail itself of all legal and equitable remedies against Applicant. Applicant agrees to pay the Township's legal fees and costs incurred in these actions.
- 5. Applicant shall at all times indemnify and save harmless the Township, its elected and appointed officials, employees, agents, and servants, of and from all claims for Worker's Compensation and any other claims which may be made by any of the employees of the Applicant or any of the employees of any Sub-Contractor to whom the Applicant may have let the performance of any part of the work embraced by this permit or any third party, and the Applicant will appear for and defend the Township against any and all such claims.
- 6. This Permit shall be binding upon and endure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective heirs, personal representatives, successors and assigns, as the case may be. All assignments are subject to prior written approval of the Township.

The Applicant shall take out and maintain during the life of the Agreement such Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance which shall protect the Township, the Applicant and any Sub-Contractors performing work covered by this Agreement from claims for property damages, as well as claims for damages for personal injury, including wrongful death, which may arise from operation under this Permit whether such operations be by himself or by any Sub-Contractor directly or indirectly employed on the project.

Notice must be given to the Lower Allen Township Police Department immediately upon 			
returning a traffic signal to normal operation.

If any portion of the traffic signal installation, including but not limited to detection devices, is rendered inoperable, Applicant will be responsible for operation of the traffic signal in accordance with this Agreement until such time as repair/replacement is completed, and the signal is returned to proper operation.
